

**CAMPBELL PARK COMMUNITY COUNCIL
RESOLUTION 2018-01**

WHEREAS, Sections of the Lake Otis Buffer Park Fence were damaged or destroyed by high winds on April 24, 2018, and

WHEREAS, The Fence had efficiently separated the Park from neighboring residential properties, providing highly desirable security, and

WHEREAS, The eight-foot high double-sided Fence was designed to greatly reduce high volume traffic noise from Lake Otis Parkway on neighboring residential properties, thereby substantially increasing capital values, and

WHEREAS, The Fence greatly reduced the opportunity for bears and moose from nearby Campbell Creek and Far North Bicentennial Parks to enter neighboring yards, and

WHEREAS, On May 24 a large brown bear from the Park traveled through residential properties, and panhandlers from the Park have since visited the neighborhood, and

WHEREAS, The Fence had served its intended purposes very well for over three decades, and the Municipality has a responsibility to restore vital public infrastructure damaged by natural hazards like high winds, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, The Municipality of Anchorage should restore the Lake Otis Buffer Park Fence as soon as possible.
