



36TH AVENUE RESURFACING

Old Seward Highway to Lake Otis Parkway



36th Avenue is a vital east-west corridor that provides a critical link between residential neighborhoods, the midtown business district, the University of Alaska Anchorage, and Providence Medical Center. Over many years of use, the condition of the roadway and sidewalks has deteriorated. The poor condition of the pavement and sidewalks requires increased maintenance and creates hazards for vehicles, pedestrians and bicyclists. The purpose of this project is to investigate the existing conditions along the project corridor, recommend improvements that align with the scope of a resurfacing project and limited budget to extend the life of the roadway, and reduce maintenance costs.

Design Study Report

The Municipality of Anchorage (MOA) Project Management & Engineering Department (PM&E) is kicking off the Design Study Report (DSR). The DSR will document existing conditions and evaluate alternatives to best address needed improvements such as:

- Roadway resurfacing
- Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant curb ramps
- Sidewalk, pathway, and curb repairs
- Drainage
- Traffic signal equipment
- Street lighting

Recommendations will be developed in collaboration with the MOA, agencies, and public stakeholders.
