- House Bill 12 – Change to Protective Orders allowing renewal or extension of existing orders
- House Bill 145 – Public Safety
 - Increased Sentencing Ranges
 - Stronger Penalties for Drug Dealers & Distributors
 - Tools for theft prosecution
 - Sex Offender Registration

- House Bill 79 - Officer Recruitment and Retention
 - Keeps Alaska competitive with improved retirement plan
- House Bill 10 - Assistance in opioid treatment
 - Assistance in recovery and return to productive lifestyle
 - Multiple misdemeanors are converted into felony charges
- House operating budget
 - Made \$200 million in cuts
 - Waiting on Senate for a Conference Committee to be appointed
 - Dividend is being discussed in multiple pieces of legislation
 - Whether or not to make it part of the Constitution is discussion

City Assembly - Adam Lees for Suzanne LaFrance

- LaFrance now Vice chair of the Assembly
- Election is Certified
- ML&P sale
 - Sale now in front of regulators
 - Comment until 13 May
- Consideration of an ordinance to ban cellphones in school zones
 - LaFrance has a conflict and is recused
 - Send comments to Weddleton
- AO201959: Trapping regulations to align with other regulations in Chugach State Park

- Tobacco Ordinances
 - No smoking within 20' of playground passed
 - 19-21 purchase age failed
 - Being added to new e-cigarette/vaping codes to collect them under one rule
- Opioid overdose deaths are down
 - Overdoses being treated reducing mortality
- Meth use is up
- Budget - 600k in the black
- More funds for homeless camp abatement and outreach
- Bear ordinance - Admin Review
 - Suggested to remove bird seed from feeders
- Marijuana consumption on site still being discussed
 - Write comments and questions to Weddleton and LaFrance
- Contact Representative Kopp and Legislator Von Imhof about budget
 - Governor's cut would remove bond debt, increasing property tax rate
 - Senate restored in full
 - House restored half
 - Governor budget hostile to local government
- Farmers markets back in May
 - Locals create more revenue for the state and locals
