ASSEMBLY UPDATE March 1, 2021

Administration Actions last Week

No emergency actions taken last week.

<u>COVID-19 Data Snapshot,</u> update as of 11:45 am pm on March 1, 2021 Three new deaths from death certificate review: Nov: Female, age 40 to 49 Dec: Male, age 70 to 79 Jan: Female, age 80 to 89 One recent death: Male, age 70 to 79 Total: 158 resident deaths and one non-resident death

14-day case rate average per 100k people: 12.29 (a decrease of 0.32 from Friday.)

Context: Averaging the per capita incidence of COVID-19 over 14 days reduces the influence of day-to-day fluctuations in the number of cases identified in a community.

7-day test positivity rate (with 7-day test reporting lag) 1.66 as of 2/22/2021 (an increase of 0.05 from Friday.)

Context: The test positivity rate is simply the fraction of tests that come back positive. A low positivity rate suggests that sufficient tests are being conducted to detect a high proportion of current cases. According to the World Health Organization, the test positivity rate from a comprehensive testing program should be at or below 5% for at least 14 days before relaxing restrictions or beginning to reopen.

Current COVID-19 hospitalizations: 14 confirmed cases and 0 PUI (a decrease of 6 confirmed cases and 2 PUIs from Friday.)

Context: Hospitalizations provide a measure of more serious disease and is less affected by fluctuations in testing. Hospitalizations may be affected both by local cases and by remote cases transferred in to Anchorage from communities lacking sufficient hospital capacity.

Anchorage staffed adult ICU Beds Available: 15 adult ICU beds out of a possible 67 staffed adult ICU beds (an increase of 8 available ICU beds and no change in possible staffed adult ICU beds from Friday.)

Context: Availability of ICU beds is an important measure of health care capacity. This count is based on General Acute Care and Critical Access facilities in Anchorage. The denominator may vary depending on staffing considerations. The number of ICU beds in use may be affected both by local cases and by remote cases transferred in to Anchorage from communities lacking sufficient ICU capacity.

Total resident cases to date, in and out of state: 26,233 (57 reported Saturday, 39 Sunday, and 19 today)

Context: Most cases only remain infectious for 10 days. Individuals may experience health effects of COVID-19 after they stop being infectious.

Vaccinations administered in Anchorage: 64,893 persons vaccinated of which 43,653 have received two doses (an increase of 1,469 first doses and 2,568 second doses from yesterday.)

Context: Currently the Moderna and Pfizer vaccines are being administered in Anchorage. Both require two doses to be fully effective. These numbers include vaccinations reported to VacTrAK, the State of Alaska Immunization Information System. Providers are required to report to VacTrAK within 14 days of vaccine administration.

Economic Relief/CARES Act Distribution Update

Rent/Mortgage Relief and Utility Assistance

Applications for rent relief at <u>https://www.alaskahousingrelief.org/</u> are open until 11:59 p.m. on March 5. As of the morning of Thursday February 25, nearly 11,500 Anchorage residents applied for rent relief out of 18,000 applicants statewide.

Tourism Relief

The application period for these grants closed last week. Visit Anchorage, the contractor managing this grant program, is close to wrapping up work on vetting the over 200 applications received and will initiate fund distributions this week.

Restaurant Recue Program

This United Way of Anchorage and Alaska Hospitality Retailers Association meals program will end on March 7, 2021. We are currently brainstorming ways to fundraise for this program to continue given the importance to our restaurant industry and recipients.

Small Business, Nonprofit, and Individual Artist Grants

Nonprofit and individual artist grants have been distributed. Cook Inlet Lending Center (CILC) has almost finalized payments from the small business assistance grants. They are working on identifying replacements for the businesses that withdrew due to eligibility concerns or have not responded to multiple solicitations from CILC.

COVID-19 Peer Leader Navigator (CPLNs) Program

Since the end of September 2020, CPLNs have reported more than 1,208 hours in direct peer support and have helped 1,237 individuals access services and information in 66 unique, countable ways. The main topics CPLNs help their peers with are food supplies, health information, rent and mortgage assistance, child care/K-12 education, employment, and public assistance. A language other than English is used for almost ninety (90) percent of CPLN support, including Amharic, Arabic, Dinka, Korean, Nuer, Russian, Samoan, Somali, Spanish, and Tongan.
