# **Administration Actions last Week**

**EO-19 Attachment E ("Organized Sports")** <u>version 3 update</u> released on Monday, March 15, 2021, that further eases and clarifies the requirement for pre-competition testing when teams based in the MOA want to host <u>indoor</u> competitions, tournaments, or meets with teams based outside the MOA. Indoor organized sports classified as "high transmission risk" are still required to follow the pre-competition testing requirement; any sports <u>not</u> classified as "high transmission risk" no longer require pre-competition testing.

# **COVID-19 Data Snapshot**,

Update as of 11:44 am on March 19, 2021

# 14-day case rate average per 100k people: 16.17 (a decrease of 0.76 from yesterday)

Context: Averaging the per capita incidence of COVID-19 over 14 days reduces the influence of day-to-day fluctuations in the number of cases identified in a community.

# 7-day test positivity rate (with 7-day test reporting lag) 2.19 as of 3/12/2021 (a decrease of 0.16 from yesterday)

Context: The test positivity rate is simply the fraction of tests that come back positive. A low positivity rate suggests that sufficient tests are being conducted to detect a high proportion of current cases. According to the World Health Organization, the test positivity rate from a comprehensive testing program should be at or below 5% for at least 14 days before relaxing restrictions or beginning to reopen.

# Current COVID-19 hospitalizations: 23 confirmed cases and 1 PUIs (no change in confirmed cases and a decrease of 1 PUI from yesterday)

Context: Hospitalizations provide a measure of more serious disease and is less affected by fluctuations in testing. Hospitalizations may be affected both by local cases and by remote cases transferred in to Anchorage from communities lacking sufficient hospital capacity.

# Anchorage staffed adult ICU Beds Available: 13 adult ICU beds out of a possible 67 staffed adult ICU beds (an increase of 2 available adult ICU beds and a decrease of 2 possible staffed adult ICU beds from yesterday)

Context: Availability of ICU beds is an important measure of health care capacity. This count is based on General Acute Care and Critical Access facilities in Anchorage. The denominator may vary depending on staffing considerations. The number of ICU beds in use may be affected both by local cases and by remote cases transferred in to Anchorage from communities lacking sufficient ICU capacity.

# Total resident cases to date, in and out of state: 27,101 (19 new cases reported today)

Context: Most cases only remain infectious for 10 days. Individuals may experience health effects of COVID-19 after they stop being infectious.

# Vaccinations administered in Anchorage: 85,900 first doses administered and 59,303 series completed (an increase of 1,919 first doses and 1,426 series completed)

Context: Currently the Moderna, Pfizer, and Johnson&Johnson vaccines are being administered in Anchorage. Moderna and Pfizer require two doses to be fully effective. Johnson&Johnson requires only one. These numbers include vaccinations reported to VacTrAK, the State of Alaska Immunization Information System. Providers are required to report to VacTrAK within 14 days of vaccine administration.

# **Economic Relief/CARES Act Distribution Update**

# Rent Relief and Utility Assistance

AHFC is processing application, and anticipates beginning payments soon. AHFC has verified income eligibility for over 15,000 applicants (statewide). Over 16,000 residents of the municipality applied for the rent relief program before applications closed on March 5, out of 29,157 applications statewide. In January 2021, Alaska Housing Finance Corporation (AHFC) was authorized by Governor Dunleavy and the Legislature to administer up to \$200 million in federal funds to eligible Alaskan renters who were negatively impacted by COVID-19. **Over 16,000 residents of the municipality applied for the Alaska Housing Rent Relief program before applications closed on March 5, out of 29,157 applications statewide.** Individuals who started their application before the deadline but failed to complete it have the chance to finish their application. Alaska Housing Finance Corp has partnered with several nonprofits to build a backend capacity capable of processing the high volume of applicants, and complying with federal verification and reporting requirements. Those partners include Catholic Social Services, Interior Center for Nonviolent Living, Kodiak Brother Francis, Love in Action, LOVE Inc Fairbanks, and Valley Charities.

<u>Coming soon</u>: Alaska will receive roughly \$200 million in additional housing relief to renters and homeowners (funds in addition to those currently being distributed through Alaska Housing Rent Relief.) While distribution and other details are still being determined, Alaska's portion includes:

- \$152 million in emergency rental assistance to help families keep up on their rent and remain in their homes.
- A minimum of \$50 million in mortgage relief to help homeowners behind on their mortgage and utility payments and avoid foreclosure.
- Emergency housing vouchers for individuals and families who are experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness (allocation for Alaska still to be determined).
- \$5 million in added HOME Investment Partnerships Program funds to help create housing and services for people experiencing or at risk of homelessness.

## Small Business, Nonprofit, and Individual Artist Grants

Nonprofit and individual artist grants have been distributed. Cook Inlet Lending Center (CILC) has sought out replacements for businesses that were selected but were nonresponsive after several attempts to contact them. Fund distribution is almost complete.

# COVID-19 Peer Leader Navigator (CPLNs) Program

Since the end of September 2020, CPLNs have reported 1460 hours in direct peer support and have helped 1705 individuals access services and information in nearly 70 unique, countable ways. The main topics CPLNs help their peers with continue to be food supplies, health information, rent and mortgage assistance, child care/K-12 education, employment, and public assistance. They are also helping peers find information about COVID-19 vaccines and sign up for appointments. A language other than English is used for almost ninety (90) percent of CPLN support, including Amharic, Arabic, Dinka, Japanese, Korean, Lao, Nuer, Russian, Samoan, Somali, Spanish, and Tongan.

# Other Updates and Information

The U.S. Department of the Treasury, the Internal Revenue Service, and the Bureau of the Fiscal Service announced that the next batch of Economic Impact Payments will be issued to taxpayers this week. Direct deposit payments began on Friday and will have an official pay date of Wednesday, March 24, with some people seeing these in their accounts earlier, potentially as provisional or pending deposits. A large number of this latest batch of payments will also be mailed, so taxpayers who do not receive a direct deposit by March 24 should watch the mail carefully in the coming weeks for a paper check or a prepaid debit card, known as an Economic Impact Payment Card, or EIP Card. No action is needed by most people to obtain this round of Economic Impact Payments (EIPs). People can check the Get My Payment tool on IRS.gov on to see if the their payment has been scheduled. This will be the second batch of payments, with additional payments anticipated on a weekly basis going forward. Additional information on this batch of payments — along with photos of the paper check and debit card and an updated Fact Sheet of Frequently Asked Questions — also available.
