 - Disaster Lite – Pandemic Response Bare Minimum
 - Relief Funds being discussed
 - \$1 billion in general relief funds
 - \$900 million spread across various specific needs
 - Details still being worked on Federal Level
 - Discussion of not spending all the money at once
 - Anchorage \$100 million directly
 - COVID-19 Vaccines are being distributed in Legislature
- Representative Tom McKay
 - State Vaccinations High
 - Case Numbers in Decline
 - Passenger Vessel Service Act discussions
 - Congressional Delegation working on it

- Official Meeting for Relief money was postponed
- Girdwood Rescue to be supplied by Bond would be used on the Highway
- Bond Funds spent by priority, if funds go unspent they are allocated to avoid funds not being put to work
- Emergency Proclamation Extended to April 16th
 - Assembly unlikely to extend
 - Allows versatility of functions and speed of fund distribution
 - Assembly is creating new rules to allow the needed functions to work outside of Emergency Proclamation
 - Tourism – Looking Up
 - Travellers are judging on our Vaccination Levels and Infection Numbers
- Meeting Regarding Relief Funds – Live Streamed - \$100 Million
 - Allocating Quickly to Waitlisted CARES Funds requests
 - Suggested that revenue comparison be used to determine need of support
 - 40 Days – 50% of Funds
 - 1 Year – 50% of Funds
- Marijuana Rules – Updating in the next month

- Goals
 - Prevent Serious Illnesses
 - Prevent Deaths
 - All Vaccines in the State near 100% effectiveness at preventing Death
 - 89% effective at preventing hospitalization
 - 75-95% effective at preventing basic disease prevention
- Pfizer & Moderna – 2 Doses
 - 1st Dose - 55% Protected from Infection

- 2nd Dose - 94% Protected from Infection
- Johnson & Johnson – 1 Dose
 - 75% Protected from Infection
- Side-Effects – Immune Response
 - Pain at Injection Site
 - Fatigue
- Employment Requirements
 - If required there will be options for those who will not get vaccinated
 - Disclosure depends upon what work you do
