# ANCHORAGE, ALASKA DRAFT AO No. 2021-XXX

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 17, ANIMALS, TO ADD REQUIREMENTS FOR ANIMAL ADOPTION FROM ANCHORAGE ANIMAL CARE AND CONTROL, BY AMENDING SECTIONS 17.05.010, 17.15.070, AND 17.25.060.

**WHEREAS**, Anchorage Municipal Code Title 17 (Animals) has been determined by the Administration and the Animal Control Advisory Board (ACAB) to need modifications in order to prevent the adoption of an animal from Anchorage Animal Care and Control into an unsafe environment;

**WHEREAS**, animals may be put in unsafe circumstances if adopted by or residing with permanently or temporarily an individual with pending charges related to inhuman treatment of an animal;

#### THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Anchorage Municipal Code section 17.05.010, Definitions, generally, is hereby amended by amending the following definitions (other definitions in the section are not affected and therefore not set out):

### 17.05.010 - Definitions, generally.

The following words, terms and phrases and their other verb forms and tenses, when used in this title, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

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Applicant means the individual, business entity, or non-profit submitting the application for a special purpose license. In the case of a business entity, the term includes all decision- making members of the business. In the case of a non-profit, the term includes all members of the non-profit's board of directors.

Anchorage Municipal Code section 17.15.070, Special purpose licensing procedures for multi-animal, mushing, commercial facility, and animal rescue licenses, is hereby amended to read as follows (the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out):

## 17.15.070- Special purpose licensing procedures for multi-animal, mushing, commercial facility, and animal rescue licenses.

C. A special purpose license shall not be issued to or renewed where the applicant has been convicted of a crime involving inhumane treatment of an animal in any jurisdiction, or has a pending case involving inhumane treatment of an animal in any jurisdiction, or resides in the same household with a person who has been convicted of such a crime or has a pending case of such a crime. **IOF AN OFFENSE UNDER TITLE 8.55 OR INHUMANE** TREATMENT OF ANIMALS IN ANOTHER JURISDICTION].

Anchorage Municipal Code section 17.25.060, Adoption exceptions and requirements, is hereby amended to read as follows (the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out):

#### 17.25.060- Adoption exceptions and requirements.

- A. The animal care and control center shall not release an animal for adoption under any of the following circumstances:
  - 1. The prospective owner has inadequate or inappropriate facilities for confining an animal or for providing humane care and control of an animal. If the prospective owner does not own his/her place of residence, the consent of the landlord to the adoption is required.
  - 2. The prospective owner has been convicted of a crime involving inhumane treatment of an animal in any jurisdiction, or has a pending case involving inhumane treatment of an animal in any jurisdiction, or resides in the same household with a person who has been convicted of such a crime or has a pending case of such a crime. [UNDER TITLE 8.55 (CRUELTY TO ANIMALS) OR INHUMANE TREATMENT OF AN ANIMAL IN ANOTHER JURISDICTION]; or has outstanding unpaid fees or fines; or has two or more violations of this title within the past 12 months.
