ii. John Weddleton

- Several members expressed dismay that the Assembly appears to have rush the redistricting process and ignored requests from Bayshore-Klatt to keep the community whole and in a single Assembly District. Deference appears to have been made to other Assembly members to the detriment of Bayshore-Klatt.

- Significant concern was expressed over the fact that the current election for Districts 3 & 6 has the effect that residents are now voting for representatives who will very soon not be in the same Assembly District.

- FEMA Covid funding. John was asked about reports that \$59M spent by the Muni on various homeless

projects might not be reimbursed by FEMA. John indicated that he is confident that FEMA will reimburse those funds. Members asked what happens if FEMA does not pay that money.

John indicated that the Muni used an "Emergency Savings Account" to fund the projects.

His description of such a fund was challenged as non-existent.
