Bridget forward funds education, higher education fund, AK Performance fund, Re-sweep funds back into AK students for college. Infrastructure. School bond debt reimbursement which will be a significant relief to property tax rates for Anchorage homeowners. Wish we had saved more, there is a concern if oil prices go down this can affect our ability to pay for state services.

-HB234 Political Contribution Limits- this will be taken on in the next legislature. Will put on a ballot initiative if the legislature doesn't do this.

- Leslie announced PEL-Seward/Glenn Hwy at an open house yesterday. They are gathering community input. Ingra/Gambell safety issues, social justice, mobility issues. How to design a road system that is people driven, not just for cars. Give input on the website and via email- will impact Mt. View, FAirview and downtown.
- CIP update/Priority List due by June 15th, 2022. Meeting over last month. CIP list, completed draft, will upload. Added some that were presented to ALCC: the drainage issue at Pokey Circle, traffic barriers 88th and Little Brook.
