Legislative report, slow now and election season. Down tick in revenue. Two million into savings to pad things, but projected savings will be reduced.

 - o Felix Rivera-
 - Homelessness-Assembly passed a few appropriations in July to deal with short term needs. These dealt with outreach, remodel United Way apartments could open up. Forward funded emergency shelter funds. \$3.4 million finalizes Guest House finish purchase of building- just waiting for the check to be written for this. ARPA Funds- \$52 million into a general bucket. 46% of this was spent on housing- low income and homelesness. Task FOrce set up last week to help with planning/management. Administration hasn't given a plan. We need to be proactive, Assembly to ask Anchorage Housing and Hoomlessness group to create a task force to help with and give input on thoughts of what to implement for this winter.
 - Budget/Alcohol tax- Administration did do some work on the money spent. Budget overage: 11 million in PFD garnishments, hotel tax and Alcohol tax monies.
 - 3rd party looking into HR department and vetting of individuals- Internal review by Administration by Amy Demboski and Niki Tshibaka. Assembly wants a 3rd party to review this. Will be looking at the Joe Gerace situation and possibly broader past appointments.
 - Meg Zaletel-
 - Transportation- Academy and Vanguard 2023-2026 up for approval today. AMAB members (Meg/Forrest Dunbar)offer a resolutions to reduce greenhouse gas reduction plan and no motorized undeveloped assets-AMATS has a mapping of this. Provides information on how neighborhoods are connected. This passed.
 - TIP- Delete 96th/ Scooter Drive project-failed, we are able to refer to the

Tech Advisory Committee. Will report back in November- this won't be funded until April, so we have time. Community wants: Walkable, multimodal access in our community. Pedestrian/vehicle crash data- most of these are on state owned roads.

- Constituent complaint of drug like activity on 84th & Spruce area.
- Alcohol tax- going to dig into the programs that have gotten funds. Approved grants for 2023 atlast meeting. Look to see how/give feedback on how the programs are working. One time funding from Alcohol tax- training for APD (Cultural competency/new laws). The funds have not been expended. Asked for a report on how funds are spent by October. January new budget- for timing and projects.
- Mobile Mental Health Crisis Team- 10am-8pm. It is funded for 24 hr operation and this will hopefully be coming. Hard time with staffing. Great outcomes. Interceding in situations that would have been calls to APD and use of Psychiatric ER.

ALCC Procedures regarding Elections of Officers and Board

Elections are held on the last Thursday of September for Officers and Board members.

Starting at the August regular meeting the Secretary shall record the names of persons interested in running for office.

At the beginning of the September meeting, the President shall call the body to order and proceed through approval of the minutes and treasurer's report.

The President will appoint someone who is not running for office to run the elections.

Nominations will be opened for each officer position one at a time. Candidates may give up to a three-minute speech on why they are running. If there is more than one nomination, a ballot for that office only will be handed to each qualified member. Three members will count the votes and report the winner of that office to the body. This process will be repeated for the other three officers, one at a time. This allows the other nominees to run for another office or board position.

Following the election of officers, a ballot for the nine-member Board of Directors will be handed to each qualified member. Nominations will be taken from the floor and each member will write any additional nominations on their ballot.

After nominations have been closed, Candidates may give up to a three-minute speech about their qualifications, interest in the Community Council, and the position. Candidates do not need to be present; however, they must have acknowledged to the Secretary they are willing to serve.

After ballots have been collected, the three-member election team will count the ballots. The meeting will proceed during this phase of ballot counting with the President resuming control of the meeting.

The results of the new board will be announced before the meeting adjourns. New Officers and Board members take office after the September meeting is adjourned.
