Meg Zaletel and Felix Rivera were present and each gave reports based on what they are doing with the Assembly, generally, and then specifically with the issues and committees they are most involved with. A representative from Elvi Gray-Jackson's office was there and highlighted the bills that Ms. Jackson had gotten passed and signed into law during the last legislative session.
