Resilience Reminders! Fall weather on the hillside brings windstorms, power outages, and slick roads. Residents are encouraged to be prepared - transition to winter with weather cycles where warming brings wind, potential rain on frozen roads; and cooling brings slick roads. Wind storms and occasional power outages are typical. Chugach Electric information on Facebook is handy, and reporting your outages and tracking events on the CEA website can help them quickly assess the scope of an outage. CEA also offers resources on preparing for power outages and will assist you with backup generator integration. A key issue is ensuring that if you use a backup generator, that it is not connected to your primary home's power and the grid in a way that might electrify the lines that are being repaired. With wells for water, a backup water supply is essential.
