Investing in parks and trails will put Anchorage on the map with the great outdoor cities of the world. For 11 years in a row, voters have said YES to Anchorage park and recreation bonds, choosing to tax ourselves a small amount, sharing in the cost of these public assets.

We hope you will vote YES on PROP A. For \$1.98 per \$100,000 assessed taxable property value we can have trails, athletic fields, bridges, rec centers, inclusive playgrounds and more. Find the complete list below.

This year park lovers have an additional opportunity to support the places we love.

ANCHORAGE

A YES vote on PROP 6 will create the Chugach State Park Access Service Area for the Anchorage Bowl. Eagle River-Chugiak, Girdwood and Turnagain Arm are not part of the proposed Service Area. This vote creates the mechanism that would allow the Municipality to bond for maintenance and improvements to support neighborhoods and respond to growing recreation demand near Chugach State Park. PROP 6 creates the Service Area only – no taxes or projects.

There is currently no public funding mechanism for roads or parks in neighborhoods adjacent to Chugach State Park.
