Information needed for Jan. 29, 2024, **Point-in-Time Count**



What is the Point-in-Time **Count?**

Done on a single night each January, the count serves as a snapshot of homelessness in our community. These counts across the nation are mandated by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to guide federal funding and help efforts to end homelessness.

Want to help? It's easy! Here's how...

Please pin the location of camps or signs of people living in unsuitable places on the Muni camp reporting map. This will help outreach teams find and assist vulnerable citizens. Help all year round: pin camps whenever you see them, but to help with the count, please do so by midday Jan. 29.

Snow can make it difficult to spot.

Homelessness looks very different in winter than in summer. During cold weather many people will find temporary solutions or "hunker down" at their camps, making it challenging to find them.

What to look for:

Below are some things that may indicate a campsite.



Makeshift Shelters

Pallet or tarp structures, "do-it-yourself" cabins, snow shelters, etc.



Camping in Vehicles

Parked vehicles & RVs that aren't hooked up to facilities.



Foot Paths

Well-used walking paths off the main trail.





A tent or a cluster of tents pitched outside of a designated camp area.
