- 6. Ted Stevens International Airport Report
 - a. No report available.
- 7. Anchorage School Board Report, Member Kelly Lessens
 - a. No report available.
- 8. Municipality of Anchorage Report Kameron Perez-Verdia, Anna Brawley
 - a. Member Perez-Verdia
 - i. Now chairing the Assembly Public Health & Safety Committee. Tracking the recent spate of officer-involved shootings and the Administration's approach.
 - ii. Interested in rewriting the code for the Public Safety Commission, which sunsetted earlier this year.
 - iii. Also co-chairing the Housing & Homelessness Committee. New Homelessness Coordinator in the Administration named Farina Brown. Suggested inviting her to an upcoming meeting.
 - iv. Winter is coming, looking ahead to developing an Emergency Cold-Weather Sheltering Plan for 2024-2025.
 - v. Prioritizing metrics to track progress on outcomes. For example, 177 people experiencing homelessness were placed in housing in the past year.

- vi. In the last Legislative Session, the Anchorage Caucus worked hard to secure a \$4M grant to fund low-barrier shelter in Anchorage. It's the first time the State has provided Anchorage funding for this purpose.
- vii. The Homeless Leadership Council (HLC) a group of business representatives engaged in the conversation about homeless and strive to bring the weight of Anchorage's business community to identify solutions. Focused on right-sizing our shelter capacity.

b. Member Brawley

- i. Co-chair of the Assembly Budget & Finance Committee.
- ii. <u>120 Day Preliminary Memo</u> forecasts major changes, priorities of the Administration before it comes to the Anchorage Assembly for amendments and approval. The Memo includes the capital project priorities of the Administration.
- iii. The CIP/CIB process is being reviewed and improved in collaboration with the Administration to move the timeline and make the process more proactive.
- iv. Looking forward to the budget, the Administration will submit the budget to the Assembly by mid-October. Public hearings will be held in November before the budget is passed around Thanksgiving.
- v. The 2022 financial audit (AKFR) was finally completed and paperwork type issues were resolved. The 2023 AKFR is now underway. We are behind schedule, but working to catch up.
- vi. The Assembly recently renamed Sand Lake Park (behind Sand Lake Elementary on the way to the water) after our sister city, Chitose, Japan. A group of former Sand Lake Elementary students who traveled to Chitose proposed renaming the park in recognition of our companion city in Japan: "Chitose Park"
- vii. The Anchorage Economic Development Corporation (AEDC) is proposing a sales tax in an initiative called "<u>Project Anchorage</u>." Liz has invited the Project Anchorage team to present at the October 21 meeting.

9. Alaska Legislature Reports

a. Senator Claman (via Claire)

- i. Passed Legislation:
 - 1. To fill the gap between criminal and civil cases where someone is unfit for trial, drawing from a stabbing incident at Loussac Library
 - 2. To expand permitted telehealth services
 - 3. To ensure fair labor rates on auto mechanics and workers and ultimately improve service to motorists
 - 4. To allow Turo to pay a lower tax rate than other vehicle rentals; the Governor vetoed the legislation

ii. Up for election in November.

b. Representative Josephson

- Summer Activities:
 - 1. Traveled to West of the Cook Inlet, visited a Hillcorp natural gas drilling rig
 - 2. Toured homeless camps, met with Alaska Housing & Finance Corporation and learned
- ii. Passed Legislation:
 - 1. Spearheaded the \$4M investment for shelter in his district in the House Finance Committee.
 - 2. Assault in the Presence of Children
 - 3. Affording Workers' Compensation to employees experiencing PTSD
 - 4. Increasing penalties for vandalism of religious institutions
- iii. Up for election in November.
