RESOLUTION 2024-1 BASHER COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Anchorage, Alaska

A Resolution Establishing a Basher Community Council Land Use and Transportation Committee

WHEREAS the members of the Basher Community Council (BCC) reside in the Stuckagain neighborhood of the Anchorage hillside and land use and transportation are important issues affecting the neighborhood; and

WHEREAS land use and transportation projects have been ongoing concerns of BCC members for many years, and many past and present officers and members of BCC have been involved in these issues, but no coordinated effort has been undertaken to advance the interests of BCC in a sustained manner; and

WHEREAS BCC members recognize that an ongoing community effort is needed to address land use and transportation issues in the Stuckagain neighborhood and Campbell Airstrip Road, such as advocating for improved infrastructure for roads, trails, and safety and providing neighborhood input on zoning or land use proposals; and

WHEREAS funding opportunities that might be available for land use and transportation projects in the Stuckagain neighborhood may be lost without a concerted effort by BCC to advocate for the neighborhood's needs and submit necessary applications and documentation;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Basher Community Council supports the creation of a BCC Land Use and Transportation Committee with the duties set forth below:

- 1. On behalf of BCC, to monitor land use and transportation issues that arise before municipal, state, and federal agencies, and identify those of potential relevance to the Stuckagain neighborhood; and
- 2. Advise the BCC of the issues identified that in the committee's judgment are likely to be of concern to BCC members;

- 3. Make recommendations to BCC members for actions to be taken with respect to the issues identified, such as taking official advocacy positions on behalf of BCC, filing applications to secure neighborhood opportunities, or submitting comments or rankings that reflect neighborhood priorities; and
- 4. Serve as representatives of BCC before the governmental bodies responsible for the issues identified, to both convey and advocate for any official BCC positions taken and keep BCC informed on the status of the issues; and
- 5. Report to the council at each regularly scheduled meeting on the status of land use and transportation projects affecting the neighborhood.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the BCC Land Use and Transportation Committee shall consist of up to six BCC members, including a chair, to be selected by the full council at a regularly scheduled BCC meeting.
