



# PROJECT FACT SHEET

## De Armoun Road Pavement Preservation:

E 140th Avenue to Hillside Drive  
Fed # 0510007/CFHWY00286

The Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF), in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), is proposing to resurface De Armoun Road from Mulligan Road to Hillside Drive. The purpose of the proposed project is to extend the service life of the facility, reduce maintenance costs, and improve safety. Throughout the project corridor the roadway is exhibiting signs of deterioration including distressed pavement, faded pavement markings, and areas with poor drainage. The project would correct these deficiencies.



### The proposed work may include the following:

- Structural section repairs
- Upgrade or rehabilitate lighting
- Upgrade guardrail including end treatments
- Drainage improvements
- Utility relocations
- Crack sealing
- Vegetation clearing and grubbing
- Upgrade signage and striping
