REGARDING ANCHORAGE SCHOOL DISTRICT RESIZING INITIATIVE

WHEREAS on November 1, 2024, the Anchorage School District made a public announcement of their intention to close seven elementary schools over the next three years as part a district wide "rightsizing" initiative, and

WHEREAS on November 27, 2024, the Anchorage School District made a public announcement of their intention to revise the initial initiative to target closure of four elementary schools by the end of the 2025 school year, and

WHEREAS the District's initiative includes three Title I elementary schools, two of which are in the northeast sector, Nunaka Valley Elementary and Baxter Elementary Schools, and

WHEREAS closing and repurposing northeast sector schools, Nunaka Valley Elementary and Baxter Elementary, will affect approximately *45% of all elementary students slated to be relocated in the Anchorage School District's "rightsizing" initiative, and

WHEREAS Nunaka Valley Elementary and Baxter Elementary Schools serve families and students that require Title I resources, and

WHEREAS Nunaka Valley Elementary and Baxter Elementary School students cope with disparities in academic growth and social proficiencies, and for whom a small school setting provides a learning environment where they will be able to receive the greatest possible assistance, and

WHEREAS special programs/charter schools/open optional/language immersion programs have trended to be in separate buildings instead of co-located with neighborhood schools, the side effect being that over time this is creating an imbalance in neighborhood schools whereby those who can afford the time and cost to drive to specialized programs are doing so, siphoning students and resources out of neighborhood schools, and

WHEREAS the State of Alaska continues to be in a state of crisis with availability of childcare and elementary school buildings could be shared to provide well suited space to support childcare and fill underutilized classroom space, and

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED the Northeast Community Council is not supportive of Anchorage School District's "rightsizing" initiative as currently proposed and as it relates to the northeast sector elementary schools.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Northeast Community Council recommends the Anchorage School District work closely with the families of the northeast sector elementary schools to

revisit the initiative for other options that may also include further shared building use with other programs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Northeast Community Council urges Anchorage School District to revisit the initiative and adopt efforts that will more proportionately affect the families and students throughout the district rather than targeting one sector of the city.
