Department of Natural Resources House Finance Budget Subcommittee



The budget subcommittee for the Department of Natural Resource met this week to begin overviews on the FY26 budget. I look forward to working with my colleagues and the executive branch to pass a responsible budget that meets the needs of Alaskans. The department's mission is to develop, conserve and maximize the use of Alaska's natural resources consistent with the public interest. The department includes the important divisions of Oil & Gas, Mining, Land & Water, Forestry and Fire Protection, Geological and Geophysical Surveys, Agriculture, and Parks & Outdoor Recreation.

HB 57 - Banning Cell Phones in the Classroom

The House Labor & Commerce committee heard HB 57 this week. This legislation directs the Department of Education and Early Development to develop a model policy relating to cell phone use in schools during school hours, that include lunch and passing periods. The restriction applies to personal wireless devices with a possible exception for emergency use.During the October 8-9, 2024, State Board of Education Meeting, the board passed a resolution regarding cell phone use in schools during the school day. The department created a draft policy, which was presented to the board, which can be viewed HERE.

Education Funding Legislation



Members of the House Majority Coalition have proposed an increase to the Base Student Allocation (BSA), and the House Education Committee is underway with hearings. <u>HB 69</u>, introduced by Rep. Himschoot of Sitka, proposes a permanent increase to the BSA over the next three years, and then into perpetuity. If passed in its current form, the budget would increase as follows:

Cost Increase for HB 69:

- FY26: \$326.3 million
- FY27: \$501.3 million
- FY28: \$645.7 million

This is a total cost over three years: \$1.47 billion on top of the current BSA. If passed, this would increase the <u>Department of Education & Early Development</u>'s (DEED) FY26 budget to \$1.58 billion — the Governor's proposed FY26 is \$1.25 billion.

The provisions of the bill provide for:

- On July 1, 2025, Increasing the base student allocation of June 30, 2025, by the average inflation adjustment of CY21-CY23, and then add \$1000.
- On July 1, 2026, Increasing the base student allocation of June 30, 2026, by the average inflation adjustment of CY22-CY24, and then add \$404.
- On July 1, 2027, Increasing the base student allocation of June 30, 2027 by the average inflation adjustment of CY23-CY25, and then add \$404.
- On July 1, 2028, and on July 1 of each year, Increasing the base student allocation in effect June 30 of the previous fiscal year the average percent of increase of the first three of the preceding four calendar years using the Alaska CPI.

I support and will advocate for our public education system in Alaska. I believe the solution to improving student outcomes and making our state a great place for teachers to live and provide for their families, not only includes funding, but strong accountability at the local school district level. The state can appropriate funds, but how those funds are spent is locally controlled and is vital to achieving the high

standards we should all expect of our schools.


Alaska LNG Project

Wood Mackenzie Analysis



ALASKA GASLINE

The Wood Mackenzie Analysis shows that the Phase 1 pipeline can deliver gas at or below the cost of imported LNG with just domestic demand. As new Anchor Customers develop, Alaskans will benefit from lower cost energy.



During the 2024 session, the Legislature passed the following intent language:

"It is the intent of the legislature that the Alaska Gasline Development Corporation continue to work towards meeting the critical energy needs of Alaskans by advancing a pipeline project proposal which would deliver North Slope natural gas to Alaska's utilities, businesses, and homeowners. Further, it is the intent of the legislature that the Alaska Gasline Development Corporation complete an independent third-party review of a project proposal that would commercialize North Slope gas and present that analysis to the legislature by December 20, 2024. It is the further intent of the legislature that if analysis shows a positive economic value to the state, all parties would work toward Front End Engineering and Design for Phase 1 of a pipeline project."

The consulting firm <u>Wood Mackenzie</u> was contracted to complete an independent third-party economic assessment of the <u>Alaska LNG Project</u> Phase 1 Pipeline. The analysis shows a positive economic value to the state.

The <u>Alaska Gasline Development Corporation</u> presented to the House Finance Committee this week on the progress of the AKLNG project. You can watch it and find the full presentation HERE.


