

**Campbell Park Community Council
Minutes of Meeting on September 11, 2008, 7:30 p.m.
Tudor Elementary School**

The meeting began at 7:40pm. Eleven people attended, plus three firefighters.

Mark Butler, Manager of the Federation of Community Councils talked about the mission, services and role of the Federation office and of community councils. Each council can use the resources for guidance, information about city wide activities and issues, and for mailings by email or by postal service. Mark distributed copies of the Campbell Park CC bylaws but members believe that newer bylaws were adopted though they may not have been filed with the federation office. Firefighters presented a report of recent activities, including training and they invited the community to visit the fire station at the corner of MacInnes and Tudor, suggesting that visitors should call first. There was a discussion of the training center which is shared with other agencies. Bids are out for a replacement training center at the same location.

Assembly Rep. Elvi Gray-Jackson gave her report covering topics of budget meetings with the city departments, curbside recycling, the re-instatement of the IM program, changing streetlights to LEDs, ongoing re-write of Title XXI (land use regulations covering planning, zoning, signs, animals), diversity month activities and the renaming of 48th Ave extension to be Martin Luther King Ave.

There was a discussion about the possibility of the council merging with another one. No decision was made. The council also talked about the need for more funding for the FCC and resolved to send a mailer to all residents of the council area. Mark will invite a speaker to talk about the curbside recycling program and the LED lights.

Next meeting will be held on Thursday, October 9th, 2008, 7:30pm at Tudor School in the Teachers' Lounge. The agenda will include election of officers.
