One of the issues of prime importance in the Rabbit Creek area is connectivity. We do not have sufficient connections between Goldenview Drive and any other major road. It is a very long and populated dead end road in an area that continues to develop without a plan.

Despite the efforts of Rep. Hawker and the hard work of Lori Davey and Susanne Comellas, the governor has vetoed funds for road planning and development for our area. Much of the major development in the area has been held up by the municipality due to lack of connectivity. Mayor Begich will meet with three members of the RCCC and two residents of the area on July 10 to discuss Legacy Point (elderly housing), connectivity, and other neighborhood concerns. On July 12 we will report on this meeting and discuss our options. Please attend the RCCC July meeting to learn more. Come and participate.

Hillside Suffers Road Funding Cuts

I am saddened to report we lost all our fund requests in the Governor's veto pen. We had requested \$4.5 million to fund the collector road from Shangri La to Rabbit Creek, \$600K to fix the approach of Bluebell onto Goldenview, \$900K to fund pedestrian improvements to Goldenview, \$250K for drainage improvements to the Road Service Area, and \$50K for the Hillside District Plan peer review. Representative Hawker fought very hard for our projects to be included in the Capital Budget. Governor Palin achieved 70% approval of the overall cuts to the Capital Budget. In order to bring our projects forward again this next year, we must convince Governor Palin's staff that these roads are the state's responsibility and are necessary to fund. We will also have to convince our legislators that we have the Governor's support or risk having same projects slashed twice.

The S. Goldenview area has sustained 51% of the overall housing growth for the entire Hillside between 2001 and 2006. We are slated to receive 74% of the current development with what is in the planning and platting processes right now. The infrastructure and roads are inadequate to handle this level of growth even though the land is apparently zoned to accomodate it.

250K Hillside District Plan for drainage study

50K funding to Citizens Advisory Committee for professional review of HDP

Next step is to keep it from being vetoed from State Budget

Jim Lamson MOA role in approving MOA funding requests
