DRAFT Minutes of Meeting on November 13th, 2008, 7:30 p.m.
Tudor Elementary School**

The meeting began at 7:30p.m. 13 people attended, plus one speaker.

The President, Peter Hamlett brought the meeting to order. Hand-outs were passed around, including a Message from Mayor Mark Begich regarding current road projects in the city and information on a national stimulus package for cities that the U.S. Conference of Mayors are requesting from Congress.

Representative Berta Gardner gave an update on the status of the recent elections.

Our speaker was Ed O'Neill from Brown Jug liquor stores and ARBRA (Anchorage Responsible Beverage Retailers Association) The topic was the problem of homeless camps, the problems they are causing neighborhoods. ARBRA is a non-profit and has been cleaning up camps for 8 years. Mr. O'Neill spoke of the different things they are working to try to solve some of this on-going city-wide problem. A representative from Senator Johnny Ellis' office spoke of a piece of legislation he is working on to help with public inebriates called Title 47.

Mark Butler (FCC Manager) filled in for Elvi-Gray-Jackson to let us know the final hearing for the city budget is November 18th. Date for appropriations is Nov. 25th.

There are vacancies on some of the Boards and Commissions of the Municipality of Anchorage. Anyone interested in applying may do so.

The property on the east side of Shelikof by Tudor is up for sale. Residents are concerned of what might be built there, and if it would impact the neighborhood more with traffic.
