Turnagain Community Council
Meeting Minutes Summary May 7, 2009

I. *Capital Improvement Project Rankings.* The Council approved capital improvement project rankings for City Road and Drainage Projects, Parks, State Roads and. Top priorities in those categories are Turnagain Street Maintenance/Improvements, Coastal Trail Buffer/Greenbelt Acquisition, and Pavement on Hillcrest Off-Ramp Minnesota Dr. to Hillcrest Dr. The rankings and details are available on our TCC website:

II. *Memorial Garden/Coastal Trail Litigation.* Assistant Municipal Attorney Robert Owens provided an update on the status of the private party litigation over the Marston/Foraker lands adjoining the Coastal Trail to the west of Lyn Ary Park and the lawsuit against the City concerning the Memorial Garden site. He thanked community members who attended the hearing on the Muni's motion to dismiss one of the private landowner's claims. Please contact Nancy Beardsley (volunteer coordinator for Anchorage Parks and Recreation) to volunteer to work on the memorial garden. beardsleynj@ci.anchorage.ak.us She will keep a log of community volunteer work in the park. [UPDATE: Since the May meeting, Judge Joannides granted the City's partial summary judgment motion and the City has filed an additional motion to dismiss the remainder of the private property owners' claims. III. *Airport Construction at Lake Hood.* Linda Bustamonte (TSAIA communications director) and Andy Hutzel (Lake Hood manager) gave an overview of Lake Hood airport construction project underway this summer. One project involves extending the road shoulder to create a pedestrian/bike path. Federal moneys for airport improvement and a match of 6.2% from airlines are funding this project. The driving force behind the project is to balance safety for the public while continuing to provide access for recreation around Lake Hood. The project should be complete by the end of summer. The Airport discussed a bank stabilization project for float plane slips and provided fliers showing erosion areas. The Corps of Engineers is allowing recapture of a couple of slips, but want to go the whole length so that a road and a taxiway can be placed on the peninsula. Two bank stabilization methods will be tested this summer in slips to see which ones should be used.
