The Fairview Community Council held its regularly scheduled meeting at the Fairview Recreation Center at 7 pm on August 13, 2009.

The meeting was called to order by Sharon Chamard, President, at 7:07 pm.

Welcome and Introductions

The United Way Community Assessment Project survey was made available to meeting participants at the start of the meeting.

Guest Presentations and Reports:

- Melinda Freemon, Rural CAP: Spoke regarding the proposed replat and proposed project on 11th and Medfra
- Julianne Hanson, HDR: Presented a Highway-2-Highway update. The project Purpose and Need will soon be inserted into the Draft
- Patrick Flynn, Assembly Representative was absent and the President reported in his stead: Wed., Sept. 9, from noon – 1 pm the Assembly public safety committee will meet regarding the chronic public inebriates
- Senator Johnny Ellis' aide reported on the Clitheroe Center.

The Treasurer's report was presented

President's Report

- The Fairview Recreation Center will not be closed as was reported on KTUU this past Tuesday.
- The 13th and Gambell project will be delayed this year. The 9th Avenue improvements have been cancelled as a part of municipal budget cuts.
- A special election will be held at the September 10 General Membership meeting for two member-at-large vacancies

Secretary's Report

The minutes from the previous meeting were read approved as corrected.

Committee Reports

Paul Benson reported that the Membership Committee will hold its regularly scheduled meeting the first Tuesday of the month at the Downtown Sagaya Market Kaladi.

Sharon Chamard reported that the Public Safety committee will hold its regularly September at 7 pm at the Fairview Rec Center.

Allen Kemplen reported that the Neighborhood Plan Committee will meet Sunday, August 23rd at Café del Mundo at 9 am. This committee meets alternating Sundays in the same place, time, and location.

Michael Howard reported on behalf of the Revitalization Committee that the Council's draft community comments on the proposed Highway to Highway alignments are available for review by the membership and will be available on the Council website. The Revitalization Committee will hold its regularly scheduled

meeting on Friday, August 14th, at NVision architecture from 11:45 am – 1 pm. This committee meets alternating Fridays in the same place, time, and location.

After some discussion about the proposed Rural CAP replat and proposed project, a sense of the body resolution was taken and adopted as follows:

“Resolved, 1) That the Fairview Community Council [has concerns about] the proposed re-platting based on negative impacts of parking, issues related to public safety, issues due to the relationship between the tenants and other problems in the neighborhood, issues related to snow removal, and issues with non-concurrence with the draft long-term vision of the Council. 2) That the Council to write a letter to the municipal platting commission to delay the platting until such time as the Council can meet with Rural CAP representatives to agree on the design and number of units for the complex.”

The President counted 10 ayes and 1 opposed.

Community Comments and Concerns:

- Sharon Chamard will invite a City representative to speak regarding the rock chip that has been distributed throughout neighborhood streets.
- Ron Alleva reported that the Post Office has posted a “no trespassing” sign at the post office, likely due to public inebriate problems.
