

**Minutes  
Tudor Area Community Council  
February 3, 2005  
Rogers Park Elementary School**

Sheli Dodson, Chair, called the meeting to order at 7:04 PM. The attendance was 4 members and 7 guests. The minutes for the Jan 6<sup>th</sup> meeting and agenda were approved with two changes in spelling.

Dick Traini, Assembly Chair, provided the assembly report. The Assembly supports the expansion of the museum. The issue will be presented to the voters in April 2005. The Assembly also approved funding for the Federation of Community Councils. They have been concerned about the level of support the federation provides to local community councils.

The Assembly fully supports the new convention center. Parking will be provided in a new garage located near the Federal Building at 7<sup>th</sup> Ave. and C St. Mr. Traini said that the Anchorage Convention and Visitors Bureau and the developer would support the convention center; no municipal tax money will be used. The issue will be on the April ballot.

Four members of A Shift of the Fire Department's Station 4 (MacInnes & Tudor), led by Capt. Veatch, updated the council on the current plans for a new fire station. He also talked about the Muni's need for a heavy rescue truck.

Sgt. Cindy Stanton, Anchorage Police Department Community Council liaison, presented a short briefing on the number and type of police calls to the Tudor Area. Her statistics are attached. Sgt. Stanton's phone is 786-2668. Her e-mail address is cstanton@ci.anchorage.ak.us.

Diane Etter gave the Federation of Community Councils report. New officers were elected, and there is a new draft worksheet for capital projects. The Parks Commission is working on approaches to build support for parks and recreation bond issues.
