to secure items in the budget that will affect our community.

Anchorage Neighborhood Renovations: \$1,500,000

Guest Speaker Jim Potts from the Department of Transportation: Spoke about the noise walls that will be coming due to the Seward Highway Project that is starting up. The Bancroft Subdivision will be affected once the construction begins to move the exit onto Brayton, south of its existing location. He stated there would not be much activity this summer, except to get the bridges fixed for the bigger construction in 2012.

Elvi-Gray Jackson's Notes are as follows:

- **Title 23 – Building Codes Public Hearing postponed until May 24th meeting. Substitute version is available online.**
- **Liquor ID requirement ordinance set for public hearing on 4/26 and includes all establishments that sell alcohol was opened and continued until 5/24. Public Safety Committee meeting was held on the issue with lots of people in attendance. There are several substitute versions of the ordinance which one includes bars and restaurants but not until a later year and the other excludes bars and restaurant. Copies be found online.**

- **Title 21 change to allow chickens passed (substitute version can be found online).**
- **1st Quarter Budget Revision and Mill Levy ordinances introduced at April 12th meeting. Public hearing was held on April 26th. Mayor's revision included:**
 - **28 person - Police Academy with a starting/hire date of 10/10/11.**
 - **6 Fire EMS positions – Medic 7 (Sand Lake)**
 - **29 Fire Positions funded by a Federal Grant**
 - **Domestic Violence Prosecutor**
 - **Gasoline costs increases in several departments.**

Assembly proposed amendments failed with the exception of the following:

- **\$20,000 for Anchorage Youth Court**
- **\$611,000 of forfeiture funds to pay related expenses for police academy**
- **\$50,000 for Asbestos abatement and other necessary rehab for engine 556 on Park Strip**
- **\$17,000 to restore closing time for Fairview Recreation Center**

The 1st Quarter Budget Revision resolution was passed and the mill levy set for both General Government and the Anchorage School District. Tax bills reached mailboxes this week.

- **May 24th meeting**

Administration will introduce an ordinance to eliminate boards and commissions other than those required by Charter or state law. Ordinance includes a sunset clause and continuation of the board of commission must be approved by the Assembly.

Next meeting – June 7th
