
TSAIA Manager John Parrott has requested to be on our agenda each month to give TCC members an opportunity to briefly discuss issues of interest or ask airport-related questions.

Project Updates

• West Anchorage District Plan — Assembly Public Hearing:

An ordinance to approve the WADP Public Hearing Draft is proposed to be introduced by the Assembly on March 27th, with a **public hearing date tentatively scheduled for April 17th**. Plan can be found at: www.muni.org/Departments/OCPD/Planning/Projects/WestAnch/Pages/WADPDocs.aspx.

This will be the final step after three long years of work. TCC needs your support on critical issues in the Plan, including telling the Assembly you:

- Oppose any land exchange that would give Pt. Woronzof Park dedicated parkland to the Airport and would allow development of another North-South Runway;
- Support protection of the $\underline{existing}$ Coastal Trail & Greenbelt Buffer west of the Airport;
- Support identifying Turnagain Bog and areas now being used as parkland on Airport property on the Land Use Plan Map as "Areas that function as Park and Natural Resources" NOT "Major Transportaion Facilities."

• Airport Fuel Tank Farm Expansion:

On February 6th, the Planning and Zoning Commission approved an amendment to allow the development of four additional jet fuel tanks to the Conditional Use Permit for Hazardous Use for the Airport Fuel Tank Farm on the west side of the Airport. After completion, there will be a total of nine tanks at the facility. TCC President Cathy Gleason testified at the hearing.

• 2035 Metropolitan Transportation Plan:

After deliberations on February 13, the Planning & Zoning Commission approved the Public Hearing Draft of the 2035 MTP. The only item they discussed was the Knik Arm Bridge Project and the uncertainty of funding, but made no amendments to the Plan. TCC's comments, including our request to delete the construction of a sidewalk and new multi-purpose trail along W. Northern Lights from Postmark Dr. to Nathanial Ct., were not discussed and the project was not deleted from the Plan. Next step is a hearing before the Assembly; date not yet set.

Summary of Decisions & Motions Passed at Turnagain Community Council Meeting February 2, 2012

- November 3, 2011, TCC meeting minutes were approved without objection.
- A motion to appoint Bill Wortman as the TCC representative on TSAIA's Part 150 Noise Study Update "Study Input Committee," with Breck Tostevin and Merle Akers as alternates passed without objection. Blythe Marston was also approved as an alternate, if she is not appointed as an at-large committee member.
- TCC passed a resolution on proposed amendments to the Provisionally Adopted Title 21 Rewrite, as put forth by the committee. Yes-8, No-0.
