

## **Minutes of the Tudor Area Community Council, October 4, 2012**

The meeting was called to order by Tod Butler at 7:05 p.m.

A motion by Julie Renwick with a second by Jake Tuckerman was made to approve the minutes and agenda. Motion carried.

Elvi Gray-Jackson and Dick Traini in the Assembly report talked about the severity of the proposed budget cuts and encouraged people to testify about the proposed cuts at the Assembly Tuesday night meetings.

Kevin Harun from Rep. Berta Gardener's office said they are working on identifying drainage problems and issues from recent storms.

There was no old business that was brought up.

Under new business there was discussion that storm drainage was maintained by MOA street maintenance and not AWWU and that more paving as the city develops causes more drainage issues as there is less space for water to drain to. It was brought up that trees that buffered the Providence Hospital parking lot from the new UAA Sports Center had been cut down after assurances from UAA representatives that they would be left standing. A thanks was issued to the person or persons who removed the fallen trees in the Helen Louise McDowell sanctuary after the recent windstorms. Someone brought up that a semi tractor trailer truck was seen driving down MacInnes against city regulations and there was discussion about whether we should contact the city about traffic calming for MacInnes.
