#### SUMMARY OF RESULTS

#### PURPOSE OF THIS SURVEY: RESIDENTS' INPUT

This summer, Mayor Berkowitz invited community councils to provide suggestions for neighborhood improvements to potentially implement in the first months of his administration.

The TCC Executive Board decided to use the opportunity to gather broad input from West Anchorage residents over the summer, including the Turnagain, Spenard and North Star neighborhoods, as outreach to residents who do not normally attend community council meetings but may have ideas to share.


The results below are a summary of residents' comments and suggestions, which we found to have some common threads. TCC exercised its role as a community forum and conduit for information, and share a summary of these results on behalf of area residents. The Council does not officially endorse, support or oppose any of these recommendations. We are sharing this summary with the Mayor's office and other community councils whose residents participated in the survey as an informative snapshot of what Westside residents told us they care about.
