BEAR VALLEY COMMUNITY COUNCIL PURPOSE

The purpose of this Council is to call forth from Bear Valley residents, participation enabling them to address local issues and to empower them to communicate about and resolve these issues in an efficient, workable, effective manner. ARTICLE IV OF THE BY-LAWS. (A copy of the By-laws will be at the meeting)

The Anchorage Municipal Assembly is required to consider the formal actions of Community Councils. If you have issues or concerns with the City or with neighborhood activities, the BVCC is an entry-level forum for addressing them. We encourage you to allocate an hour of your time, once a month on the 2nd Wednesday of each month. Good place to meet your neighbors, bring a friend.

ELECTIONS WILL TAKE PLACE FOR ALL OFFICERS. TO BE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE, YOU MUST BE A MEMBER AND HAVE ATTENDED AT LEAST 1 MEETING IN THE PAST 12 MONTHS PRIOR TO THE ELECTION. TO RUN FOR OFFICE, YOU MUST HAVE ATTENDED AT LEAST 2 MEETINGS IN THE PAST 12 MONTHS.

Any person 18 years of age or older whose primary place of abode (tenant, resident homeowner or family members) is within the Council's geographical boundaries is eligible for membership. If more than one qualifying resident shares the same habitual, physical dwelling address, each may be a Council member. Alternate designations for resident membership shall not be recognized. There is no proxy voting; you must be present.

A person is a voting member upon fulfilling the requirements set forth above and appearing at a scheduled meeting and signing as a registered member.

Agenda: 7 p.m. Meeting called to order and member sign in and determination if a quorum of 7 members is reached. Immediately thereafter: discussion of continued issues (fire safety and early warning system; Section 36 park status; moose poaching prevention; "dark skies" in our Bowl for Aurora Viewing; noise/party issues; strangers in neighborhood in parked cars.) New issues identified; election voting. PLEASE COME AND MAKE THIS HAPPEN!

NEIGHBORS ARE GOLD

We have lots of new neighbors! Please take time to **meet and welcome new neighbors** in your immediate area. **Please let them know that we live in natural bear habitat and that GARBAGE CANS cannot be put out "the night before" pickup. THIS IS OUR MAIN SAFETY ISSUE.**

Please let them know that **STARTING NOW bears usually are in our immediate back yards and therefore it is UNSAFE to allow children, pets, or stock to be outside UNSUPERVISED.** Please let them know that SHOOTING is not a safe way to protect against bear or moose attacks. Keep your dogs at home: loose dogs can be killed if they harass livestock.

AN OUNCE OF PREVENTION IS WORTH A POUND OF CURE. BE BEAR AWARE! BE KIND TO MOOSE!
