 January 4 — Planning & Zoning Commission Deliberation on Draft Municipal Code for Marijuana <u>Establishments</u>, 6:30 p.m., Assembly Chambers, Loussac Library, 3600 Denali St.
 Case No. 2015-0119 — This is an ordinance that would add new sections to Title 21 Municipal Code to enable marijuana establishments in certain zoning districts, and amend current Code to enable retail marijuana stores in the downtown (Central Business District). *Public hearing was held on Dec. 14<sup>th</sup> and is now closed*. The commission has asked staff to draft a number of amendments for consideration at their Jan. 4<sup>th</sup> meeting. <u>The</u> ordinance is tentatively scheduled for introduction to the Assembly on Jan. 12<sup>th</sup> — with the Assembly public hearing to be held on Jan. 26<sup>th</sup>. TCC created a Marijuana Committee at our Dec. 6<sup>th</sup> meeting to follow local marijuana-related items, but had not yet met before the P&ZC hearing. - January 8 <u>COMMENT DEADLINE</u> Fish Creek Trail Improvements Project Design Study <u>Report & 35% Design Review</u>. This mile-long project includes upgrades to a southern section of Fish Creek Trail between 45<sup>th</sup> Ave. and the Taft St./W. Tudor Rd. intersection and a northern section between Kiwanis Fish Creek Park and Barbara Street Park. Trail upgrades include resurfacing trail, replacement of four Fish Creek bridges, replacement of lighting, minor improvements to the trail grade and alignment, and removal of select nearby trees and installation of root barriers to reduce future pavement damage caused by root intrusion. Design will continue through 2016, and construction is anticipated to begin summer 2017. An overview of the project was presented at the Dec. 6<sup>th</sup> TCC meeting. A TCC Committee is being formed to review and provide comments/recommendations.

Northern Lights Blvd. Preliminary designs were done for these two roads in 2011; a Draft Design Study Report has now been done as well. Additional funding has been acquired for the final design study, detailed design, pre-construction tasks and rightof-way acquisition. NO CONSTRUCTION FUNDING HAS YET BEEN RECEIVED FOR EITHER PHASE. Construction for Turnagain Blvd. (Phase I) could start in 2017, while Turnagain St. (Phase II) may be several years out. <u>These two road projects are the highest ranked CIP road projects for TCC</u>. An ordinance of proposed Cell Tower Title 21 Code Revisions is tentatively scheduled for introduction to the Assembly December 22<sup>nd</sup>, but the hearing will be delayed until February 23<sup>rd</sup>. In the meantime, the Planning and Zoning Commission public hearing is tentatively set for February 1<sup>st</sup>. These revisions address, among other things, public notice requirements and height allowances and types in zoning districts. A group of residents from various community councils has reviewed the ordinance, drafted amendments, and has proposed a resolution for councils to consider — TCC Committee has been collaborating with this group. The resolution will be considered at TCC's Jan. 7<sup>th</sup> meeting.

## **PROJECT UPDATES:**

### APPROVED — West High School & Romig Middle School Campus Site Renewal Project

On December 9<sup>th</sup>, the Urban Design Commission approved a plan to amend the existing West-Romig campus site plan. Improvements include: new, consolidated bus drop-off area on west side of West/Romig building; new bus-only access road on west side of campus with ingress/egress at Hillcrest Dr. & WNL Blvd; modifications of northwest parking lot; restriping of West bus drop-off area; dumpster screening; and new site lighting. Also approved were three "Project Additive Alternatives" that will be part of the improvements, if funding allows: construction of new Romig parking lot; reconstruction of hockey rink boards/fencing; and two new outdoor tennis courts. The TCC SRTS Committee submitted comments to the Muni Planning Dept., which were affirmed at the Dec. 3rd TCC meeting. Committee members also provided testimony at the hearing. Based on SRTS/TCC input, Municipal staff and the UDC incorporated some of our recommendations to improve pedestrian safety at the campus.

#### Kiwanis Fish Creek Park & Barbara St. Improvements

The Muni Parks Dept. is proposing upgrades to Kiwanis Fish Creek Park and Barbara St. Park for summer 2016. A community advisory group has met twice (Nov. 24 & Dec. 16), to discuss park strengths/weaknesses and make recommendations for potential themes, playground equipment and other potential amenities. Project proposals are scheduled to be presented at the February 4<sup>th</sup> TCC meeting.

#### • Airport Part 150 Noise Study

FAA approved the Noise Exposure Maps and Noise Compatibility Program on November 17<sup>th</sup>. The measures <u>not</u> <u>approved</u> by the FAA for federal noise funding are: the noise barrier on the northeastern boundary of the airport along the Turnagain neighborhood boundary, the ground run-up enclosure, and gate electrification and preconditioned air at all jet bridges. FAA's action completes the Part 150 Noise Study — a final Study Input Committee meeting will be scheduled in early 2016.

#### AWWU Fish Creek Sewer Rehabilitation Phase 3

Construction continues on repair of the 36-inch sewer in the Alaska Railroad Right of Way. <u>Clearing and large</u> <u>construction equipment and dump trucks traffic through this area will occur, to access the construction site.</u> Construction will be trenchless technology, but excavation pits will be necessary to access the pipes on either side of the railroad tracks. (Work anticipated for Phase 3 to occur November 2015-March 2016.) <u>CHAIN LINK FENCING</u> <u>WILL BE PLACED ON BOTH SIDES of the railroad ROW between Westchester Lagoon and W. Northern Lights as</u> <u>part of the project.</u> This will be on the Dec. 3<sup>rd</sup> TCC agenda.

#### Northern Lights Blvd/Benson Blvd. Improvement Project Update

This project is now in winter shutdown — work will resume in spring 2016. Upon completion, both Northern Lights Blvd./Benson Blvd. will be repaved and have new signage and striping, curb ramps will be upgraded to current ADA standards, and automated traffic recorders and signal system will be improved. #### • Spenard Road Reconstruction Project — Hillcrest Dr. to 30<sup>th</sup> Ave.

This Municipal road project is starting up again, after a conceptual 3-lane design (one lane in each direction with a two-way center left turn lane) was presented in 2011 as the best way to improve vehicle, pedestrian, and bicycle safety. Improvements are expected to include a new road base, curb and gutter, storm drain, transit improvements, lighting upgrades, pedestrian crossing improvements and landscaping.
