# • DEC Permit Approved for Chemical Applications to Eradicate Elodea at Lake Hood & Spenard Lake

At the April 4<sup>th</sup> Lake Hood User Group meeting, DNR Invasive Plant & Agriculture Pest Coordinator Heather Stewart provided an update on the effort to eradicate the Elodea plant at the Lake Hood Airport. Last year, after Elodea was discovered at Lake Hood, an emergency exemption was approved to apply two chemicals (Diquat and Flurodine) to the water last summer and fall. On March 24<sup>th</sup>, 2016, DEC approved a four-year application permit to the Airport for use of these chemicals, to continue Elodea eradication efforts in the Lake Hood/Spenard Lake waterbodies.

## Turnagain St. & Turnagain Blvd. Upgrades

A project Open House was held January 13<sup>th</sup>, with Preliminary designs for both roads presented (materials are posted on the project website). TCC provided initial input in 2011. A Draft Design Study Report has now been done as well. Additional funding has been acquired for the final design study, detailed design, pre-construction tasks and right-of-way acquisition. NO CONSTRUCTION FUNDING HAS YET BEEN RECEIVED FOR EITHER PHASE. Construction for Turnagain Blvd. (Phase I) could start in 2017, while Turnagain St. (Phase II) may be several years out. <u>These two road projects are the highest ranked CIP road projects for TCC.</u> A project presentation was made to TCC at our Dec. 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting. TCC committee project recommendations were presented and approved by the council at our February 4<sup>th</sup> meeting.

## • Fish Creek Trail Improvements Project Design Study

This mile-long project includes upgrades to a southern section of Fish Creek Trail between 45<sup>th</sup> Ave. and the Taft St./W. Tudor Rd. intersection and a northern section between Kiwanis Fish Creek Park and Barbara Street Park. Trail upgrades include resurfacing trail, replacement of four Fish Creek bridges, replacement of lighting, minor improvements to the trail grade and alignment, and removal of select nearby trees and installation of root barriers to reduce future pavement damage caused by root intrusion. Design will continue through 2016, and construction is anticipated to begin summer 2017. An overview of the project was presented at the Dec. 6<sup>th</sup> TCC meeting. A TCC Committee has been formed to review and provide comments/recommendations as soon as possible.

## • Neighborhood Streets Qualifying for Traffic Calming Assistance

The Municipality of Anchorage has released an updated list of streets that have qualified for traffic calming assistance. TCC had submitted a list for consideration and two of the streets — McKenzie Dr. (from Aldren Cir. to Milky Way Dr.) and W. 33<sup>rd</sup> Ave. (from Turnagain St. to Wisconsin St.) — made the "Qualified Streets List." #### • Northern Lights Blvd/Benson Blvd. Improvement Project Update

This project is now in winter shutdown — work will resume in spring 2016. Upon completion, both Northern Lights Blvd./Benson Blvd. will be repaved and have new signage and striping, curb ramps will be upgraded to current ADA standards, and automated traffic recorders and signal system will be improved. Completion is schedule for June 2016.

## • Spenard Road Reconstruction Project — Hillcrest Dr. to 30<sup>th</sup> Ave.

A project Open House was held February 11<sup>th</sup>. In response to public comments, the proposed 4-foot bikeway will be upgraded to 5-foot bike lanes on both sides of the road through the entire length of the project. This is in addition to the 8-foot-wide multi-use pathway. Adjacent properties will be impacted, requiring acquisition of additional right-of-way. Updated preliminary design drawings showing the changes will be posted on the project website as soon as available. THIS PROJECT WAS INCLUDED IN THE APRIL 5<sup>th</sup> BALLOT ROADS AND DRAINAGE PROPOSITION — WHICH WAS APPROVED BY ANCHORAGE VOTERS.
