1 **AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 2**  
2 **SECTIONS 2.40.035: RECOGNITION OF COMMUNITY COUNCILS; 2.40.040:**  
3 **ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMUNITY COUNCILS; AND 2.40.090: COMMUNITY**  
4 **COUNCIL MAPS, IN ORDER TO CARRY OUT THE 10-YEAR REVIEW AND**  
5 **ADJUSTMENT OF COMMUNITY COUNCIL DISTRICT BOUNDARIES.**

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8 **WHEREAS**, Anchorage's community council districts are recognized by the  
9 Municipality in the Anchorage Municipal Code (AMC), Section 2.40.040,  
10 *Establishment of Community Councils*, and their boundaries are set forth in AMC  
11 Section 2.40.090, *Community Council Maps*; and

12 **WHEREAS**, AMC Section 2.40.040, *Establishment of Community Councils*,  
13 requires the Municipality to review all community council district boundaries every  
14 10 years and seek public input as to whether any boundaries between community  
15 council districts should be adjusted; and

16 **WHEREAS**, these decennial boundary reviews are required to ensure that the  
17 geographic boundaries of community council districts adjust through the decades  
18 of neighborhood change to continue to reflect and represent actual neighborhood  
19 communities, and that all citizens continue to have opportunity to be represented  
20 by an active, engaged community council for their area; and

21 **WHEREAS**, AMC Section 2.40.040 establishes the criteria for delineating  
22 community council districts, which include to define community council districts so  
23 as to group residents within natural communities and recognize community desires  
24 as to boundaries; and

25 **WHEREAS**, AMC Section 2.40.040 establishes an open public process for these  
26 periodic reviews, in which the municipal Planning Department must obtain public  
27 input and the participation of the community councils in considering possible  
28 changes to community council district boundaries, and the Planning and Zoning  
29 Commission and Assembly each must solicit and consider the recommendations  
30 of community councils concerning changes to their boundaries; and

31 **WHEREAS**, these periodic boundary reviews and adjustments support the  
32 success of community councils in their function as neighborhood forums for  
33 participation and organized neighborhood advocacy and action; and

1       **WHEREAS**, the Municipality previously conducted comprehensive community  
2        council boundary reviews in 2003 and 2014; and  
3

4       **WHEREAS**, the Planning Department, with the support of the Municipal  
5        Ombudsman, initiated a new decennial review of community council boundaries in  
6        2022 and 2023 with outreach to the Federation of Community Councils and the  
7        officers of community councils, a widely distributed online questionnaire survey,  
8        and the formation of a *community councils boundary advisory committee*; and  
9

10       **WHEREAS**, the Planning Department and boundary advisory committee held six  
11        publicly noticed meetings to evaluate approximately 40 boundary study areas  
12        identified by the public, applying the municipal boundary review criteria and inviting  
13        public participation; and  
14

15       **WHEREAS**, the recommended community council districts and boundaries in this  
16        ordinance and accompanying maps in Exhibit A reflect the results of this public  
17        process; and  
18

19       **WHEREAS**, this ordinance and accompanying exhibits were released on  
20        October 1 for two months of public review and comment and a public hearing at  
21        the Planning and Zoning Commission was scheduled for December 2, 2024; now,  
22        therefore,

24       **THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:**  
25

26       **Section 1.** Anchorage Municipal Code Chapter 2.40, Community Councils, is  
27        hereby amended to read as follows (*the remainder of the chapter is not affected*  
28        *and therefore not set out*):

30       **2.40.035      Recognition of community councils; special ex officio**  
31       **community council recognition for Girdwood Board of**  
32       **Supervisors.**

## **2.40.090      Community Council Maps.**

A. *Purpose.* The community council maps of this chapter have the following purposes:

1. Provide residents of the municipality with a clear and accurate set of descriptions for all community council districts and their boundaries, together in one accessible document, and in a consistent format:

2. Ensure that residents can easily read, understand, and define their community council district boundaries: and

3. Document future changes to community council district boundaries in this section.

B. *Map Interpretations.* The community council maps in this chapter shall be interpreted as follows:

1. A community council district boundary line on the map that follows a street, highway, or railroad or the meanderings of a river or creek on the map shall be interpreted as following the centerline of the street, highway, railroad, river, or creek.
2. A community council district boundary line on the map that follows a property line or section line on the map shall be interpreted as falling on that property or section line as it existed on [date of adoption][THE 22ND DAY OF JULY, 2003].
3. A community council district boundary line on the map that follows the boundary of a public land or facility that is shaded on the map shall be interpreted as falling on the boundary of that public land or facility.
4. Where a community council district boundary line on the map does not follow a road, stream, property boundary, or section line, and instead follows some other prominent physical feature such as a ridgeline between watershed valleys, the community council district boundary shall be interpreted as falling on the feature that is labeled alongside the boundary line.
5. The boundary of a community council that abuts, adjoins or is adjacent to either Turnagain Arm or Knik Arm of Cook Inlet extends seaward to mean high[LOW OR LOWER] water.
