MAYOR

- Serve 3-year terms (remember to vote this April! <u>www.muni.org/elections</u>)

- Sets the budget and responsible for day-today management of the city




- <u>12 Members</u> 2 from each district
- 3 year terms half of body up for election each of the two years between mayoral elections
- Sets Municipal policy by enacting laws
- Approves budget and appropriates funds
- Certifies elections



HOW IS LAW PASSED IN ANCHORAGE?

ASSEMBLY ORDINANCES

- The rules for Anchorage are in the
 Municipal Charter (local Constitution) and
 the Anchorage Municipal Code of
 Ordinances, called "Code" or "AMC"
- Changes to the Charter have to be approved by the voters
- Changes to the Code are done through Assembly Ordinances (AOs) and are approved by the Assembly

HOW IS LAW PASSED IN ANCHORAGE?

ASSEMBLY MEETINGS

- Twice a month on Tuesdays, 5-11pm
- All proposals for ordinance changes (AOs)
 require a public hearing. When the item is
 called on the agenda, you can go to front of
 room to speak for up to 3 minutes
- After public hearing and debate, Assembly Members vote on the item; it usually becomes effective immediately

ASSEMBLY MEETINGS

- Open Meetings Act prevents Members from discussing legislation with more than two other Members - Members can't vote count or coordinate with others besides the sponsors
- Nearly all Assembly business transpires in public meetings - livestreamed and recorded:
- Worksessions presentation and questions no debate or public testimony options
- **Committees** ~10 committees that meet monthly with departments & community partners

ASSEMBLY WORK PLAN

- Annual review of current year accomplishments
 + goals & priorities for upcoming year
- June Rules Committee: deep dive on Plan
- Shorter quarterly checkins on the Plan



2024 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

HOUSING & HOMELESSNESS

Cut red tape to allow more types of housing, lower costs, and incentivize new housing. Fully funded 2024-2025 ECWS and successfully received \$4M for shelter.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Port of Alaska Modernization Program, Anchorage Hydropower Utility, snow removal working group

PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY & QUALITY OF LIFE

Eklutna River Restoration, 24/7 mobile crisis team, body worn cameras

QUALITY MUNICIPAL SERVICES

Allowed online bidding for municipal contracts, alcohol tax strategic plan, completed audits
