#### **Presentations**

- Title 21 Amendment Francis McLaughlin and Michelle McNulty (Planning and Zoning)
  - Homeless and Transient Shelters in B3 and B2C zoning districts
  - Anchorage Assembly requested a change in the homeless housing areas
  - Currently Homeless Shelters are only allowed on public lands
  - New zoning would be within one half mile of bus routes
  - This would possibly allow the Hope Center to be a permanent shelter instead of temporary
  - The amendment process for Title 21 process begins with the most affected community councils. Community discussions and public hearings are scheduled thereafter.
  - A project schedule has been established
  - Next process step is to meet with all community councils
  - Public hearing draft is for January, May/June Assembly approval
  - Discussion ensued
  - Hope Center requested a meeting with Planning and Zoning for clearer understanding and participation
  - Jason Motyka entered discussion regarding shelters in the Elmore Rd. area
