- Mike Ward moved to approve the resolution to support the Anchorage Assembly Approval of the Our Downtown: Anchorage Downtown District plan 2021. Amanda Moser seconded the motion. Motion passed.
- Fairbanks Area Surface Transportation (FAST) on Complete/Green Streets Design Jim Renkert and Jackson Fox (15minute presentation)
 - AK Forestry Director plant trees and sustain trees. A St and E. St. sidewalk cell trees. Other areas of downtown will also have upgrades like trees and hanging flower baskets
- o Jackson Fox Fairbanks reporting on what they did there. Director of FAST planning in Fairbanks.
 - State organization transportation roads and walks. Independent 501(c) agency.
 - 2015 main street in Fairbanks Cushman Street. Enhancements along the roadside.
 Took 3 lanes down to 2 lanes. More space for pedestrians and bike riders
 - \$10 million dollar reconstruction also included underground work, power, water & communication lines
 - 10' plus sidewalks allows for tree wells and planters
 - Outlet boxes at the bottom of the planters for Christmas lights, also new winter street lights
 - Decorative fencing, Way Finding signs, for pedestrians and drivers
 - Tree well design showed graphics
 - Project 12 blocks long 80 Birch trees used, 120 planters in between the tree wells
 - Green Infrastructure Installations for public and private properties
