- Work on the 9th Avenue Reconstruction project will likely begin this summer with the Cordova to L Street portion; the eastern Cordova to LaTouche section is planned for 2010. Funding to complete the eastern half is included in the road bond on the ballot on April 7.
- The alley-widening project in 16th Avenue Terrace (AKA Chance Court) will be completed this summer. Although two houses had to be demolished, and some

end result should be beneficial to people who live in that part of Fairview. Fire trucks will have easier access in the winter, and there will be wonderful amenities for pedestrians.

The contract for the Fairview Community Recreation Center Renovation Feasibility Study will be awarded very shortly. This study will measure the current uses of the facility, assess community needs, and determine what should be done to the buildings.
