Starting on February 3rd, 2025 The Salvation Army's Clitheroe Center will be accepting referrals for our 3.1 ASAM Substance Use Treatment Program!

Who We Are

We are a Substance Use Disorder (SUD) treatment facility for Men struggling with substance use. Our care team consists of SUD Counselors, case managers, behavioral health associates, and a residential nurse. Our facility provides meals and comfortable lodging while participating in their treatment program.

In addition to providing quality SUD treatment for our clients, the following is part of the 3.1 program's arch of treatment

3 Phases of Care



Phase 1: Introduction to Life Skill Development

Resume Building, Support in accessing interview clothes, identification cards, food stamps, Medicaid, community resources goal/life planning, and mock interviews



Phase 2: On the Job Learning

Case Managers assist by coordinating with "Learning Locations" within The Salvation Army's programs in Anchorage, AK to provide the client with hands on work experience



Phase 3: Find Employment

Case Manager's work with you to find long term employment and resources to find long-term housing



Clitheroe Center

The Salvation Army Clitheroe Center (TSACC) is a comprehensive substance abuse treatment facility, offering personalized treatment services focused on addressing the substance abuse and mental health issues of individuals and their families in residential and outpatient settings.

Services provided include:

- Individual Assessments
- Outpatient Treatment (Level 1 and 2.1)
- MRT
- · Residential Programs
- Continuing Care

The TSACC is licensed and funded, in part, through grants from the State of Alaska Department of Health & Social Services Division of Behavioral Health. The program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF).

We believe that clients who invest in their treatment program increase their chance for a successful outcome. We are able to accept various forms of payment.

Staff

Our staff is a multi-disciplinary team consisting of a combination of degreed professionals, state-certified substance abuse counselors, and other professionals committed to reducing the impact that substance abuse has on individuals, families, communities and the entire State of Alaska.

Individual Assessments

Individuals seeking services are given a thorough, confidential evaluation to determine the extent of their treatment needs. TSACC provides:

- Assessment interviews and testing
- Intake processing for Clitheroe admissions
- Evaluation and referrals to other agencies

Men's Residential Program

The Men's Residential Program provides an intermediate and long-term residential treatment environment for men whose lives have been severely impaired by substance misuse. Each individual works with his treatment team to identify specific target areas that will be addressed during his stay. The men's program provides habilitation; rehabilitation, as well as individual, group. and family counseling services for men who have been unable to deal with chemically dependent or chemically abusive behaviors which interfere with attaining their stated life goals. The men's program supports and encourages clients to address underlying social, emotional, physical, spiritual, vocational, and habitation issues that may affect their sobriety. Mental Health Services are offered to clients experiencing mental health issues which are affecting their ability to remain sober.

Women's Residential Program

The Women's Residential Program provides habilitation; rehabilitation; and individual, group, and family counseling services for women who have been unable to deal with chemically dependent or chemically abusive behaviors which interfere with attaining their life goals. This includes the lifestyle and life choices that addicted women often find themselves living and raising their children in. The women's program is based on research that indicates the etiology and progression of chemical dependency in women is different from that of men. The treatment needs of women are best met by programming specifically designed to address the unique strengths and challenges of women. Mental Health Services are offered to clients experiencing mental health issues which are affecting their ability to remain sober.

Continuing Care

All clients completing primary treatment at TSACC's Residential Facility are referred to Continuing Care. This program supports clients in their ongoing recovery from our Outpatient location.

Outpatient SUD Treatment

The TSACC Outpatient Program provides level 1 and level 2.1 SUD treatment to men and women over the age 18. Groups and individual sessions are designed to empower individuals to achieve wellbeing and balance in recovery. These programs are intended to foster participation and a sense of community, which research shows is an integral part of long term recovery.

S.A.T.S.

Substance Abuse Treatment Services (S.A.T.S.) at Hiland Mountain Correctional Center and Goose Creek Correctional Center include intensive outpatient, dual diagnosis, medication assisted, psychoeducational and even residential treatment. The S.A.T.S. Program is a comprehensive rehabilitative program for offenders suffering from addictions. The purpose of the program follows it's mission of reformative programs which will not only increase the safety of the facilities themselves, but safeguard the public upon inmate release and reduce recidivism for the offenders.

Community Intensive Outpatient

The Community Intensive Outpatient (CIOP) Program provides level 1 and level 2.1 cognitive behavior therapy to challenge criminal thinking and behavior. The CIOP program is offered to individuals under DOC supervision in the community.

MRT

The TSACC Outpatient Program offers Moral Reconation Therapy (MRT) as part of treatment and also as a stand-alone service. This therapy is designed to assist individuals in identifying and changing problematic patterns of behavior and thinking.

ADIS

Alcohol and Drug Information School (ADIS) is offered for individuals with legal requirements. Please call 276-2898 for dates and times.
