Resolution of Support for Pedestrian and Driver Safety Improvements on Muldoon Road

WHEREAS, the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) and the Municipality of Anchorage have reported a significant increase in pedestrian fatalities in 2024, and with an increase to date in 2025, highlighting the urgent need for safety improvements; **and**

WHEREAS, the Northeast Community Council (NECC) is committed to supporting the goal of Vision Zero, which seeks to eliminate fatalities and serious injuries on Anchorage roads; **and**

WHEREAS, the DOT&PF has identified that limited street lighting, high vehicle speeds, and the need for greater public awareness have been recognized as contributing factors to pedestrian fatalities, particularly in high-risk corridors such as Tudor Road, Muldoon Road, and Bragaw Street; **and**

WHEREAS, Muldoon Road in particular has high vehicle traffic, concentrated transit usage, and high speed in this dense residential area of Anchorage; **and**

WHEREAS, there were previous efforts by the NECC advocating for safe pedestrian crossings due to the high volume of foot and bike traffic crossings on Muldoon Road, such as a suggested overpass from Creekside Center area to Chanshtnu Muldoon Park; **and**

WHEREAS, the NECC seeks community connections without barriers that physically and visually divide Muldoon Road and our community; **and**

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the NECC supports the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities and the Municipality of Anchorage in their efforts on Muldoon Road to:

- 1. Strengthen enforcement;
- 2. Implement permanent radar feedback speed signs;
- 3. Reduce distances between existing crosswalks by constructing signalized pedestrian only crossings:
- 4. Construct a non-motorized overpass from Creekside Center area to Chanshtnu Muldoon Park:
- 5. Support an ongoing public education campaign for pedestrian-safety.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the NECC opposes construction of a Barrier Wall Fence in the northeast area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the NECC urges timely implementation of these measures and encourages all residents to adhere to the safety initiatives for the benefit of the community.
