Our children's safety is a high priority of the council. It is the reason why we have been advocating a redesign/rebuild of John's Road where Ocean View Elementary School is located. We need to provide our kids a safe route to walk in the dark winter mornings.

Our Political Representatives, Assemblymembers, Chris Birch and Jennifer Johnston, Senator Lesil McGuire and Representative Craig Johnson have spent considerable time trying to secure the funding to fix the issue. They were successful in getting the funding approved through the Legislature in Juneau only to have Governor Palin veto the project last May, except for \$1m for design.

The Council has recently been informed by the Alaska Highway Design Chief that due to a lack of Federal Funding, John's Road will likely not be funded in the near future and is redirecting the \$1m back to the State and will only repair "the most critical aspects".

This is indeed not good news for our community. We need to decide quickly where the critical aspects are and vocalize them before the funds are used on another project or for other government

Old Seward Construction

Last month we had a presentation from Tim Croghan, the State Project Manager, and a representative from Quality Asphalt Paving, aka QAP. The Old Seward Project will happen as follows:

The 2009 season construction will begin with the round-a-bout at Huffman and will coordinate with numerous other projects; water, sewer, gas, electrical and cable utilities being installed. The community requested this coordination to prevent digging up the utility replacements at a later date. Expect closures at Klatt and Huffman intersections a few weekends and complete road closure while working on the gas line. The project includes new access on Gambell from Klatt to 120th for the westside. Daryl Street will open to the skating rink traffic lights on the eastside.

Two lanes will remain open during high traffic periods with work beginning on the East side. As the season comes to an end work may continue 24/7 if the project is behind schedule.

The 2010 season will continue to the North side of Klatt road to O'Malley and if everything goes as planned, should be completed by the end of summer. There is an open house on the project at Sunset Hills Baptist Church, located on Old Seward just North of Huffman, 5/12/09, from 5-8pm.

Huffman Construction

unbearable traffic conditions for our
community. In 2011 Huffman will
be completed from New Seward up
to Pintail.

Ocean Breeze










Our Council area is a coastal community overlooking Turnagain Arm in Southwest Anchorage. Below is a map of our Council area.
