Zoning Clash

For several years tension has been growing between two different zoning use property owners next to each other in our council area. One side is residential zoning and the other is heavy industrial. The area is specifically off of 120th, right behind the red Video City building west of the railroad tracks.

The industrial zone, on seven acres, is being used as a staging area to store horse manure before it is hauled off to the valley. This type of zoning is limited, there is no where else in Anchorage to rid waste for horse owners. The business owner has generally been operating per what his zoning allows and stepped up to fulfill a need when no one else would.

The residents have photos, logs and diaries of how their quality of life has changed. During the summer months they endure high decibels (80db is legal for heavy industrial use), dust from heavy trucks running to and fro, obstruction of previous mountain views, and a constant stench of horse manure. Residents claim some days the pungent smell provide no feasible relief for fresh air outside or inside their homes.

The business owner believes the complaints are coming from a handful of residents and has made accomodations for the dust, smell and noise by building a large dirt berm along the property line.


