#### Capital Improvement Program

At this time of the year, the Municipality of Anchorage requests projects for the Capital Improvement Program, a funding plan for local bond and state grant requests. Nine project management and engineering projects as well as two state road projects have been suggested for the Council area. Other ideas may be offered, and the Council has the opportunity to prioritize projects. Johns Road Upgrade was noted as a Capital Improvement Project several years ago and may be included in the State budget this year.

If you see a need for infrastructure improvement in our area, such as; stop signs, drainage, lights, and roads, please come to this meeting, we would love to get your input before submitting the priorities.

#### Attention Aviators!!!

In recent months the EPA (in conjunction with Friends of the Earth) has announced plans to eliminate 100LL, AV gas with low lead. Approximately 95% of all commercial aircraft in Alaska require 100LL. No alternative fuels are positioned in time (target date of 2016-2017) to replace the standard 100LL Fuel. Non-lead fuel will not work in any aircraft engine over approximately 180 hp due to lead acting as an effective "lubricant" and contributing to combustion control by preventing detonation and preignition. Un-leaded fuel options are economically costly and financially prohibitive, especially for the survival of over 400 outlying settlements in Alaska.

What does this mean? Unless someone can come up with an inexpensive device to adapt to current airplane motors to use non-lead gas before 2016, airplanes in Alaska, 95% of them, will be worthless. This is not only a critical to the aviation industry in Alaska, over 400 communities in our State will become completely isolated from receiving supplies.

This is a Federal Law and you may contact Murkowski, Begich and Young to stop this or request technology catch up with an economical way to adjust to this change.
