Minutes: September 12, 2013 minutes copy placed on line for review with copies handed out and reviewed on computer screen during meeting.

Motion to approve by Nancy Pease 2nd Mike Kenny - Passed with no objections.

Treasurer's Report: Checking: not available

Fire Station 10 had 3 firefighters from tonight's shift in attendance and discussed questions from the floor:

- Captain C. Keen Austin and two fire fighters in attendance.
- Discussed fire wise conditions this summer. No major events on Hillside during dry spell.
- Fire Department considering 2 acres being bought for Fire Station 9 at the park New station being revisited again. Then the MOA would dedicate the remaining 9 acres as a park.

Assembly and State Legislative members - None in attendance. Always invited.

Boy Scout member attending as part of his Eagle Badge.

On-Going Business:

Moen Park Improvement update by Jim & Michele Rogers

- Steve Rafuse MOA Planner discussed
- Challenge Grant by the Roger's
- Legislative request at \$200,000 going to the Juneau next year. Looking for letters of support sent to Mr. Rafuse. A letter from the RCCC would help.
- 110 people showed up at Moen Park volunteer day on Sept 15th work day.
- Volunteer fix-it day will be scheduled next year.
- 2001 master plan prepared.
- If funding does come thru, they have formed a committee to identify and prioritize improvements.
- 1st committee in two weeks to do a walk-through at the Moen Park. 9/23/2013 at 1730 hrs.
- Opening of a new park Campbell Creek Estuary. Ribbon cutting at noon tomorrow. Mayor will be there. Overlooks are in place, signs look great.
- Number 1 amenity for neighborhoods: Trails, Parks, Health Club
- Motion Nancy Pease 2nd Keith Guyer RCCC draft a letter to support the Moen Park Upgrade. Motion passed unanimously. Michele Rogers to draft and submit to Nancy.

Golden View Drive Upgrades Update by Todd Jacobson

- Funding available a little over \$3.0 million.
- Will be 65% done with design by end of 2013. Dec 11th a 65% open house at Golden View Middle School
 - o Should have a really good idea how much the project will cost.
- Money requests: 2014 at \$11.0 million 2015 at \$16.2 million + \$1.0 million from ATRSA bond
- Work north to south in phases, depending on funding.
- MOA requesting \$9.3 for Mountain Aire Drive in 2015

- Bluebell Drive requesting \$1.6 million in 2016 that will be add to the Golden View Drive project, during the same phase.
- Last Monday meeting recommended an ordinance to place rural street lighting standards.
- Joan Diamond asked about how to keep speed limit at 35 mph. Streets designed for 85th percentile of what people drive. Study has been performed. 45 mph will be proposed as the design speed.
- MOA Traffic engineers to discuss subject with are Steve Schrader or Stephanie Mormilo.

Street Lighting update by Ric Davidge

- Ordinance passed at MOA with 1 descent.
- Com Ferguson, State official, asked Stephanie ??, MOA official, a question about State built roads that do not have continuous street lighting, ".... the state has built lots of roads, do you think they are safe?" Answer: ".... safe but we want our MOA roads to be safer."
- Assembly announced that staff make their own standards. Void area for rural lighting standards. Stephanie only has one lighting standard, an urban standard. Assembly will come up with lighting standards.
- Roads can be designed to slow cars down.
- Friday 10/18/2013 at 10:30 am 8th floor of City Hall, there will be a MOA Assembly work session about street lighting.
- Pat advises that Design Criteria Manual is not a legal document as an ordinance. State has produced a standard for rural lighting.
- Ric Davidge has been invited to other Community Council meetings to discuss street lighting. A rural alliance is being formed.

164th Avenue Road Drainage Project Update

- Request is on CIP list.
- Hawker advises that Community Council's needs to agree to money and RCCC has not agreed on this project.

Park Dedication Effort Update by Nancy pease

- 1. Pat and Nancy and Joan went to meeting with Jenifer Johnson and MOA folks. 3 things came out of meeting:
 - 1. After investigation, 20 parcels on list. Jenifer says she will put on a list to dedicate land as parks. Time frame of when this would occur was not established.
 - 2. Get HLB to come talk about park lands in our areas.
 - a. Pedestrian easements that are platted but not identified. Pursue with PM&E as a project.
 i. Example Trail along Little Rabbit Creek in new Creekside Subdivision.
 - 3. People blocking easements that run thry or adjacent to their property. Needs ordinance to enforce access. Suggest take control out of Enforcement Division and give it to Right-of-Way Division.
- 2. No action except to make phone call to Jennifer Johnson to encourage action.

- Recommendation for funding by legislature for
 - 1. Complete design,
 - 2. Robust stakeholder buy-in of the designed project,
 - 3. Right-of-way resolved,
 - 4. Before funding the total construction of the project. Passed unanimously.

Todd Jacobson has suggestion on CIP projects.

- Initial Funding Need enough money to get design completed with all right-of-ways resolved. Also need complete buy-in on design by all parties.
- Most CIP projects are premature.
- For Mountain Air Drive Project:
 - 1. Ask for enough to do complete design and follow the above methods.
