- Vince Beltrami Candidate for Senate Seat M as Independent. Present to offer comments and present his experiences.
 Many years in different positions throughout Alaska.
- Joe Albrecht MOA Fire Department Station 10 phone 267-5010 Concerned about too many dead end streets in our neighborhood. This summer's McHugh Creek Fire, the only reason it did not take out 300 homes is the wind was blowing in the right direction, away from homes. Bear Valley only one way out via Clarks Road. Concerned about Shangri La Subdivision and difficulty getting there from the Fire Station 10. Takes over 8 minutes. There certainly will be a fire in south end of Anchorage someday. People were building their own fire line during last summer's blaze. AFD and specifically Joe, has done a lengthy study of the south end of Anchorage dead end streets and developing alternate escape routes and offering road design suggestions to alleviate. Joe mentioned several simple ways to open up secondary escape routes. Others options would cost millions. The AFD report was submitted to superiors last week for review and will be available soon for the public.

Public Meeting

• E 142nd Ave Project – Gentleman working with The Boutet Co and Todd Jacobson. Selected contractor beginning to work on Buffalo & 142nd intersection this weekend. Will work until cold weather shuts them down. Return by June 2017. Next year scheduled to work along 142nd from the lower west end up the hill. Contractor is JT Construction. Awarded \$357,000 for base bid work, based on unit pricing by bid process. Gentleman looking for breakout price for Buffalo Street, since the project was for 142nd Upgrade, wondered why so much effort was being done on Buffalo Street with funds intended for 142nd Street. Suggested that other funding be appropriated for the Buffalo Street efforts. Response was that the Buffalo Street work is required to accommodate upgrades along 142nd Ave. Ditch design issue has been discussed extensively to ensure drainage from springs/moist areas in roadway are diverted into side ditches and allow the road prism areas to remain dry in the future to prevent road failure. Underground water is an issue on that road. The new design includes a burrito wrap of stone in geotex along north side ditch, being the best repair possible with available funding. Best science studies indicate that water traversing thru the soil is coming from north. Bid Alternates were not awarded as not enough available funding. Alt 1 at \$37,000, Alt 2 ?? Traffic management - flaggers and signage, moving school bus stops. Bulk of traffic from 7:00 am to 8:00 am. Over 2,000 vehicles per day with school in session.

Ongoing Business

- 142nd Ave Road Action Requests Comments above.
- Communications List Request from FCC No comments by Vivian Mendenhall.
- Case 2016-0101: Title 21 Changes follow-up from 2016-0034 Nancy Pease Title 21 changes came in April included: windows facing street, size of garages increased, fast track of drainage planning, airport hangars, duplexes in some areas.
 - o Text amendments MOA shortcut to amend the code. Limit amendment to to 2x per year, unless special emergency. Proposing changing until 2019 MOA can fast track on anything they want to bring up. Assembly can adopt without P&Z hearing and maybe no public comment available. Garage size in R5, R6, & R7 most generous size of garage at 10% of lot size. Pretty big garage is possible. Aircraft hangar on private residential lot can be same size as house at legal airstrips. Windows – 10% of wall area for windows on street side can go down in size.
 - Comment by a lady that she would like to see a way to enable changes to Title 21 more than 2 times a year would be helpful. John Weddleton advises that he agrees. Everyone wants to see that public hearings are available. Scheduling them together is preferred.

 • Motion Dianne Holmes & 2nd Nancy Pease – Continue to require public hearing with 30 day notice for public
 - hearing and to bundle amendments. Discussed previous RCCC letter and possibly revising. Objection by lady about the original letter not working and needs to be re-written. Motion passed unanimously. Committee to write a letter.
- Stewart Homestead Road Update Mayors office heard the RCCC letter loud and clear. Mr. Pugh had meeting with MOA officials. Issues about the whole Potter Valley, not just the Stewart Road. Greatland Trust was asked to participate in organizing a process for resolution of issues. Pugh interested in participating in the process and developing reasonable solutions. Intend to contact the entire community and present solutions. There was a suggestion by Mr. Pugh that RCCC assist Greatland Trust and stakeholders to sponsor getting the information out to the public.

 • HLB Replat into 3 tracts Parcel 2-144 - Sept 14th Council comments due. 1) At rugby area tract there are questions
- about residential structures on the plat. 2) Concern about notes that need to be on the plat, that were not put on the plat. 3) Do not adequately describe public access.
- Motion Nancy Pease & 2nd Dianne Holmes To form a committee to write a letter about the above issues. Passed unanimously.
- · Pedestrian pathway issues briefly discussed.

- Case 2016-0093: Laborers Center Rezone Hard to understand what it will end up being. Northern half to be rezoned to B3. Southern part rezoned to R3 multi-family housing. Develop R3 area within 3 years. Comments:
 - Motion Nancy Pease & 2nd Dianne Holmes Buffering at borders and structure height concerns due to more density. Concerned about different densities on this new zoning as compared to existing adjoining properties zoning. Passed unanimously.
- Plat 12304 driveway on Wood Haven in Manytell Area Motion Adam Lees & 2nd Keith Guyer Table this issue until next meeting. Passed unanimously.
- 2016-01013 Septic at storm water retention ponds State & MOA need new sediment and gunk cleaning areas for sucked up sludge material from retention ponds. Need to locate a new site in or around our RCCC area to retain State permits. Want to place in R5 and R6 zone areas. Hearing on Sept 19th, Community Council comments are overdue.
 - o Motion Nancy Pease & 2nd Vivian Mendenhall Consider this issue as an industrial use requirement that should not be in residential zones. Letter to be written. Motion passed.
- Curb design in cul-de-sacs no comments.
- Comment Dianne Holmes discussed apple and cherry orchard and helping older folks in our community. Florence Thornton who used to live the southeast corner of Rabbit Creek & Golden View was found living in her basement and eating out of cans, many moons ago. We all just need to be concerned about our neighbors.
