Suzanne arrived later in meeting. Adam Lees acting as Suzanne's designated Representative, gave brief announcements, things are boring. Massive amount of liquor license protest. Half of Girdwood on Jack Sprat because of a parking ordinance. Stream setback is going to the assembly, but no idea when it will be there. Every Community Council is opposed. Dianne Holmes advised Stream Setback did pass at some Community Councils. Idea for Hillside to be exempted, legal maneuver by 50' setback with hard 25' & soft 25' setbacks. Council believed science. Commissioner asked for amendment to exempt Hillside area, and voted down 3 to 5. Suzanne arrived. Spending time on liquor license, stream setbacks.

 John Weddleton – Arrived. Approved HLB 5-year plan. Moved 1 project. 9 acres to long term instead of current disposal.

Updates, Announcements, & Presentations

• -Halo Chairman - Matt Burkholder at halohrdtsc@gmail.com - Trying to get things organized better. Lots of LRSA and road districts and they want to find a way to make things better. Did a study with a HALO committee. Ann Brooks provided a presentation with numerous slides regarding Hillside Service Areas-Reconfiguration Initiative. Reviewed a detailed handout. Initiative is to get information out to folks. Why consolidate LRSA's? A lot of different entities. Showed a map. Issues include: 1) inefficient and inconsistent service. 2) Wide range of management capacity. 3) Lacks political influence competing for limited funds. 4) Low prioritization of hillside issues. 5) Property values are negatively impacted. What's in it for hillside? Consolidation offers: increased efficiency. Support property values. Reduce government footprint. Maintain our autonomy and control. Areas are challenged to: provide capital, resolve drainage issues. Cover trail maintenance.

Options advanced by HALO:

- 1. Status quo, leave things as they are. Pro issues: Homeowners are satisfied. No mill rate change. Maintain local control. Cons: inefficient and inconsistent service. MOA is proposing a MOA Storm Water Utility to assume authority for hillside and impose new and additional rate structure. LRSA and RRSA Board seats are difficult to fill with qualified candidates due to small population group.
- 2. Rural Infrastructure Service Areas 4 Cons Consolidation of all public and independent entities. Pros -Reduce entities. Participate in bond financing. Authorized to construct and maintain infrastructure economies of scale. Board from larger population, resolve inconsistent service issues. Cap of risa.
- 3. Single Service area One entity professionally managed. Pros Same as 2. Cons Reduces contractor pool.
- 4. General Timeline 2018 gather feedback, address stakeholder issues. 2019 report back. Then Vote.
- 5. Need Community Council Feedback.
 - a. LRSA can't get funding. RRSA can get funding. Full authority
 - b. Survey 64 received so far. Urge all to take the survey.
 - c. Adam Lees offered numerous comments.
 - d. Can't do a write-in on ballot for LRSA Seat, unless that person has registered for the seat before the election. Unfilled seat remains that way until next election.
 - e. Sept 6th HALO 7:00 pm Meeting with those who created a model for LRSA. Who can offer. Annual meeting is June 7th. Oct 4th is Candidate Forum.
- Monty Rogers (Commission Member) MOA Historic Preservation Plan MOAHP Can be historic sites, Potters Marsh, Identify, protect historic and economic benefits. Diversifyour economy. Social Benefits. Policy 51 of Anchorage 2020 which directs the Muni plan. Commission duties- Historic Preservation Officer Duties. Reviewed Current Program Efforts Draft MOAHP, Title 21, HP Fund 740, CC Summaries, MOAHP Ordinance, Historic Things, Reviewed who they work with. Reviewed things that they look at for historic things. Planning Process and meetings they have performed. Online Survey with 400 participants. What is in the Draft Plan? The Heart of the Draft MOAHP Themes, Vision, Goals, Policies, Action Items. Where do Proposed Action Items Come From? What are Proposed Actions? What Can You Do? Comment Period ended April 30th. Public Hearings in August. Compiling all Public Comments to update the draft plan.
 - David Michael described his situation with his homesteaded family. Described pioneer roads in our area.
 Will contribute notes to MOAHP. Talked about numerous locals who went into the government.

- Nancy Pease Provided a handout entitled Proposed Changes to the Draft MOA Historic Preservation Plan, with several items requiring action, as follows:
 - Delete the bulleted item that says: Encourage increased development and density in the Lower Hillside, especially in the BLM Lots, near existing infrastructure. And Insert the adopted HDP Policy 1-A Encourage a greater proportion of future Hillside growth to occur in the lower Hillside, in areas located closer to existing services.
 - Revise the bulleted item regarding drainage and streams by adding intent to protect water supply.
 "Protect drainage corridors streams and aquifers to protect the water supply and natural hydrology and to provide open space for recreation and views (HDP). Add the underlined wording.
 - Delete the bulleted item that says: <u>Extend municipal road services</u>. This could be interpreted top
 advocate extension ARDSA. The intent of the HDP is to establish Hillside roads, trails, and drainage
 district.
 - Motion Nancy Pease & 2nd Ky Holland BLM Lots west of DeArmoun Road HDP looked into taking them off of implementation list. Protect Water Supply. Extend MOA Road Service should not support. Implementation Plan. As described above. In Favor 20 and 0 opposed. Motion passes.
