WHEREAS, the fence at the northwest corner of the Sanctuary is owned by the State of Alaska, but operated and maintained by the Municipality of Alaska as a park enhancement, and

WHEREAS, the current wooden fence is used by people conducting illegal activities out of sight of the street, including what appears to be drug dealings and drug use, and

WHEREAS, the Geneva Woods Homeowners Association represents the owners and residents of approximately 140 properties, and

WHEREAS, the Board of the Geneva Homeowners Association has been asked by members to seek installation of a replacement barrier which will limit vehicle access to the Sanctuary while allowing visibility within the Sanctuary from the street,

WHEREAS, the Geneva Woods Homeowners Association is wholly within the boundary of the Tudor Area Community Council and asks the Council to support this effort,

THEREFORE, the Tudor Area Community Council asks the Municipality of Anchorage to replace the fencing with a new fence offering greater visibility to help protect the Sanctuary and neighborhood from illegal activities.
