
Safer Seward Highway Updates

These formal public hearings, conducted in accordance with the DOT&PF Environmental Procedures Manual, are being held to consider the economic, social, and environmental effects of the project and its consistency with the goals and objectives of community planning.

All events are from 5:00–7:30 p.m. (presentation at 5:45 p.m. and public hearing at 6:15 p.m.) Snacks will be provided.


