MOA Housing Repair & Rehabilitation Program

The Anchorage Health Department announces that the Housing and Community Development Action Plan Substantial Amendments noted above are available for review and public comment on the Municipality of Anchorage's website. The Annual Action Plan proposes how U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funds will be used to meet the national objectives of decent affordable-housing, suitable living environments, and expanded economic opportunities for low-income households and neighborhoods.

Substantial Amendment #5 to the 2021 Action Plan allocates \$494,357.18 of CDBG funds and Substantial Amendment #1 to the 2025 Action Plan allocates \$197,968.00 of HOME funds to the housing repair and rehabilitation program. The draft Amendments are available at: <https://tinyurl.com/AHD-CSD>.

The Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) is developing the Alaska Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) 2055 and invites you to participate in a series on online focus

group meetings. These meetings will gather input on specific transportation topics to help shape the statewide Transportation Assessment, goals, policies, and long-range strategies.

All focus group meetings are open to the public and will be held online. Each meeting will be 60 minutes long and facilitated by the project team. Meetings will include a brief overview of the LRTP and the topic area, followed by guided discussion and opportunities for public comment. Participants are welcome to join one or multiple meetings.
