JBER Public Comment Period for Improvement to Installation Perimeter Security

The Department of the Air Force (DAF) has prepared a Draft Environmental Assessment (EA) in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the Department of Defense NEPA Implementing Procedures (June 2025), and the DAF NEPA Implementing Procedures (March 2026) to evaluate the potential for environmental impacts associated with proposed actions to improve installation perimeter security at Joint Base Elmendorf Richardson (JBER), Alaska. The purpose of the Proposed Action is to improve installation security, first prioritizing critically deficient locations and then addressing other vulnerable areas to prevent unauthorized pedestrian access onto the installation from uncontrolled access points.

Based on the analysis in the Draft EA, the DAF has prepared a draft Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI). The DAF has also considered the necessity of impacts to wetlands and floodplains in accordance with Executive Orders 11990, Protection of Wetlands and 11988 Floodplain Management. Having avoided and minimized the potential for adverse effects to the maximum extent practicable, the DAF has also prepared a draft Finding of No Practicable Alternative (FONPA). The DAF is requesting public input on the Draft EA and the Draft FONSI/FONPA pursuant to NEPA, 42 United States Code § 4321, et seq.

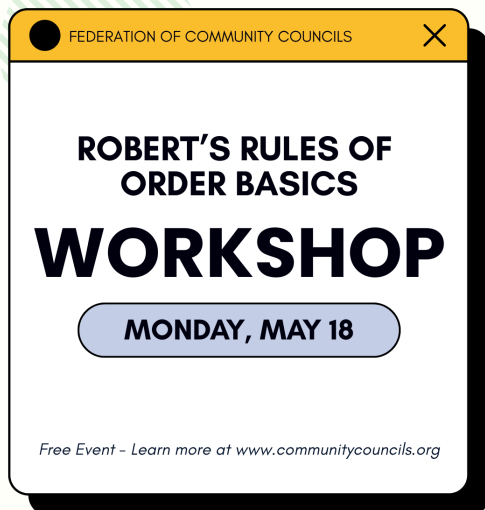
Join us for an in person workshop that will teach you the basics of parliamentary procedure and leave you feeling empowered to participate.
